KU's Humphrey, Duncan Leave On Trip's First Leg

Grant Humphrey, 5519 will begin an intensive one-week training period at Clackamas High School before embarking on a month-long tour of Japan in July and August. The Klamath Union junior will represent the state at 130 pounds.

The tour, a cultural exchange program in which Oregon wrestlers are repaying the visit of a team of Japanese national high school champions to this state last winter, was conceived and consummated by Dr. Dale Thomas, wrestling coach at Oregon State University. Funds realized when the Japanese were in this country are financing the return.

Humphrey, English-born son of Mr. and Mrs. Cyril Humphrey, will be joined by nine other wrestlers and two coaches on the tour, which leaves Portland July 9 by Pan-American jet flight and stops off two days in Hawaii. A 2,000-mile tour with Japan will include nine wrestling stops and take the group to areas seldom visited by tourists in the land of the Rising Sun.

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Straight Hitting Golfers Will Win

CLEVELAND (UPI) — The golfers who hit 'em straight rather than long were favored in the crack field of 150 who started out today after the \$22,000 first place money in the \$110,000 Cleveland Open tournament.

"There's no premium on hitting them long here, but there is in hitting them straight," said Mike Souchak, hoping to get back on the winning track because "I always play well in the Cleveland area."

Souchak explained that to stick on the hard, fast greens of the 6,618-yard Beechmont Country Club course with its par of 35-36-71, "you have to play your approach shots off fairly level, otherwise you are in trouble."

Although big Mike is in the long, rather than straight, hitter class, he received a lot of support because he always has done well in this section. The last time here, in 1959, he finished one stroke behind Low Finsterwald in the 1959 Carling Open.

Ahead Of Leaders

In that straight hitters class, the pros put U. S. Open champion Julius Boros, Gene Littler, Doug Sanders, Gardner Dickinson and Billy Maxwell ahead of the "big three" of Arnold Palmer, Jack Nicklaus and Gary Player.

Boros was being discounted a lot because he admitted he was tired from his Open playoff victory over Jack Cupit and Palmer on Sunday at Brookline and really considered withdrawing from this one.

"But I could use the money," smiled Boros, who has won \$44,155 in the last six weeks.
