

# Portland Loses To Rangers; Oklahoma City Tops Tacoma

Pitcher George (Hooks) Brunel of Oklahoma City has finally found himself. If he continues the type of mound performance he has shown in his last four outings, he'll be due for a return ticket to Houston of the National League.

Thursday night he fired his third shutout of the current Pacific Coast League campaign and second in a row. He gave but five hits in winning his sixth decision in eight starts. His latest victim was Northern Division's second place Spokane to the tune of 4-0.

Earlier in the year he had a shutout, then had another on June 16 and on June 22 gave up a single run to Denver. So, in his last four games he has given up but one run.

The 28-year-old southpaw fireballer is an Oklahoma product, being born in Seminole. He started his pro career in 1953 and from the looks of things he'll be

around a long while. He has seen major league service with Houston, Kansas City and Milwaukee, coming to the Bees from Houston.

Faltering Tacoma dropped another close one to Hawaii, 3-2. Ron Moeller was stingy with leads, giving the Giants but five while Tom Satriano and Carlos Bernier thrilled the 4,188 fans with round-trippers to ice the contest. Satriano's came with a man aboard.

Tacoma's Tim Talley came on a single by Jimmy Ray Hart which scored Jesus Alou who had doubled. The other came when Ricardo Joseph homered in the ninth.

The loss reduced Tacoma's edge over Spokane to one game and the Islanders moved ahead of Portland, just three games behind the leaders.

Right-hander Bob Baillargeon kept Dallas-Fort Worth in definite contention with a 5-4 decision over Portland. Two home runs by the Beaver catcher, Bill Bryan,

was not enough to earn a victory for his club. Both came with a man on.

It was the first victory of the year for Baillargeon.

The Rangers took a 3-0 lead in the third inning when George Banks got an inside-the-park home run, scoring two mates ahead of him. He drove the ball off the fence and left fielder Hector Martinez was struck in the face by the ball. As he lay stunned on the ground, Banks and the two runners ahead of him scored. Banks also doubled in the second run in the fifth.

The Salt Lake City Bees downed Seattle for the fifth straight time 6-6 in an error-filled game. The winners also had home runs by Bill Cowan and Lou Holdener.

Starter and winner Phil Mudrock almost blew the tilt in the ninth when the Rainiers scored three runs on a homer by Archie Skeen. Fred Buschette stopped the uprising to give Mudrock his fourth win.

Pete Smith was the loser and now has a 6-8 mark.

The game was played in Ogden because of a schedule conflict in Salt Lake City. The largest crowd to see the Bees in Utah turned out for the game when 2,371 paid. In an exhibition game the Denver Bears, last in the PCL's Southern Division, looked like champions as they slaughtered the Milwaukee Braves of the National League 16-1. Dick Kelley held the Braves to five hits, going all the way.

A crowd of 11,145 watched the Bears knock starter Frank Funk and four other hurlers all over the lot. J. W. Porter and Steve Demeter got round-trippers in the first inning and rookie Woodie Woodward got one in the third with a man on base. Woodward and Chico Salmon each had four for five as the Bears cracked out 17 hits.

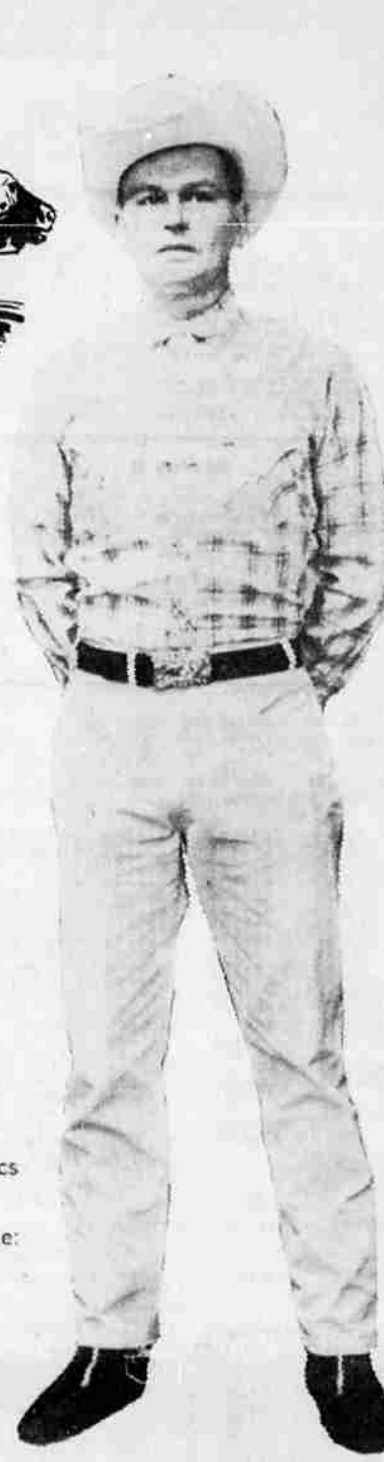
