

Neuberger Cites Report On Dunes Bill

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Maurice Neuberger said today an Interior Department report shows no immediate need for acquiring commercial property for the proposed Oregon Dunes National Seashore.

The Oregon Democrat said the report, made by assistant interior Secretary John A. Carver, "should lay to rest some of the irresponsible rumors which have been circulated by opponents of the Oregon dunes bill."

She said the study indicated that many commercial enterprises in the area were offering services which would be sought by visitors. Mrs. Neuberger said her Oregon dunes bill specifically prohibits condemnation of residential property. She described contrary contentions as "legalistic hokum."

"The record clearly shows intent of this legislation is to permit purchase by the federal government only if the seller is willing," she said.

Carver's report to the Senate Public Lands subcommittee said it was of "utmost importance" that the department retain its authority to take commercial and industrial property by condemnation when necessary.

Scranton Asks Rights Of Minority Be Upheld

GETTYSBURG, Pa. (UPI)—Gov. William W. Scranton today officially opened the centennial observance of the Battle of Gettysburg with a plea for the nation to work the will of the majority "without trampling the rights of the minority."

Pennsylvania's chief executive, in an address prepared for delivery at the Eternal Peace Light Memorial commemorating the largest and bloodiest battle ever fought in the Western Hemisphere

said one of the primary tasks facing America today is "driving prejudice out of the human heart as rapidly as we are learning to drive men into outer space."

Scranton said the "paradox" of the Civil War was that it was fought with both sides invoking the same principles, and the American nation "went to war with itself shouting the same slogans, fighting for the same broad principles—man's ancient and natural desire to be free."

They ignored State Department warnings of possible five-year prison sentences and up to \$5,000 fines and went more than 8,000 miles out of their way to make the trip.

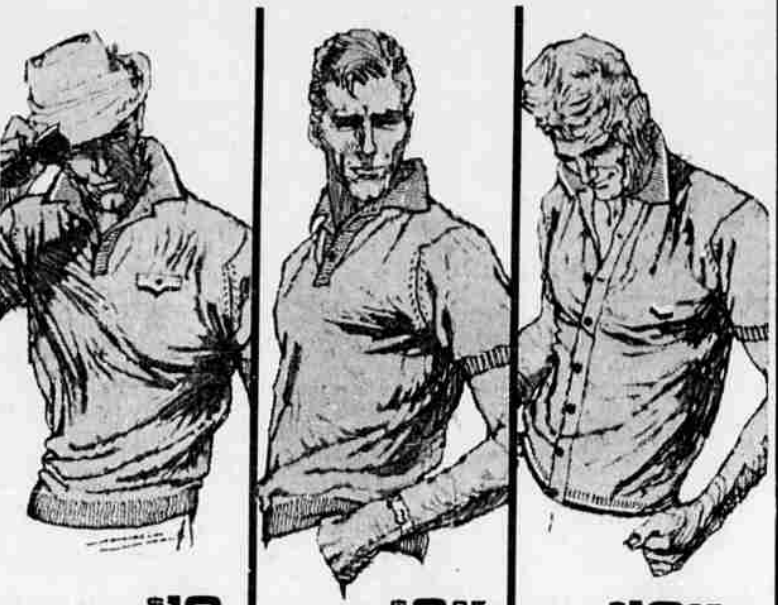
He said they had no political motives for the trip and merely wanted to "see what's taking place on this island '90 miles from Florida' as we are tired of canned reports, misleading synopses, garbled accounts, half-truths and no-truths."

The students arrived aboard a Cubana Airlines plane from Prague for the visit, which is being paid for by the Cuban government.

They were welcomed at the airport by Student Union leaders of Havana University and Robert Williams, former official of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), currently a fugitive from a kidnapping charge stemming from a racial clash in Monroe, N. C.

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Piper Denies New Trial In Horse Theft Case

The motion for a new trial on behalf of Wilbur Hixson, 42, and Perry Chocktoot, 30, convicted of acting in complicity in the larceny of two horses last fall, was denied by Judge Donald A. W. Piper following a hearing in Circuit Court No. 2, Monday.
