

Memory Of War Victims Color Israel Thinking

As the state of Israel has struggled toward self-sufficiency and a place in the world family of nations, two conditions peculiar to Israel alone have colored its actions and its thinking.

One is the memory of six million Jewish victims of Hitlerism which has prevented normal relations with West Germany despite vast infusions of West German money into the new state.

The other is the continuing state of war and suspicion between Israel and its Arab neighbors, which occasionally erupts into violence despite peace-keeping efforts of the United Nations.

It was then with special bitterness that the Israelis reacted to news that German scientists were at work in the United Arab Republic helping President Abdel Gamal Nasser to build up his armaments in aircraft and rocketry.

The argument which boiled up in the Knesset (parliament) had its offshoot in a trial in Basle, Switzerland, of two men convicted of attempting to "coerce" German scientists in the U.A.R. through threats and an attempted kidnapping.

The defense charged that the German scientists were attempting to help complete "what Hitler failed to do" and that deadly cobalt 60 ostensibly imported for medical use actually was intended for Egyptian rocket warheads.

Between the Israelis and the Arabs it was an old story of espionage and counter-espionage, of charges and counter-charges.

In December, 1960, the Israelis had aroused U.S. concern and Arab suspicions when the word leaked out that Israel secretly was constructing a powerful nuclear reactor in the Negev. It was a recurrence of the nightmare having to do with expansion of the "atomic club."

Never Test Friendly Looking Bear

SMOKEMONT, N.C. (UPI) — Never trust a friendly looking bear. He may be cute, but he's also the most dangerous of North American wild animals.

This advice comes from rangers here in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park, but it's valid anywhere a bear's loose—from Maine to Glacier Park, Mont., and the Sierras of California.

Every summer unwary tourists across the land and in National Parks are scratched, fanged or badly frightened by a suddenly angry bear. People who try to be hospitable to bears regularly find that Mr. Bear enthusiastically bites the hand that feeds him.

Take the case of a Dubuque, Iowa, man who visited the park here several years back. Dis-

obeying signs and printed advice he hopped out of his car and went up to a friendly looking Mamma bear and her cubs with an offering of peanuts.

The she-bear, known as a sow, thought the corn-state tourist was trying to get between her and the cubs, and she took immediate exception.

When a park ranger drove by on patrol in his pickup truck a few minutes later, the motorist had retreated to the top of his car—minus part of his jacket and shirt—and with a nasty scratch down one arm. The bear was trying to get inside the car and the Iowan's wife was hysterical.

There is almost nothing the boorish tourist will not do to and

with bears. One man tried to shove a grown black bear into the front seat of his car so he could take a picture of it sitting next to his wife.

A horrified ranger spotted this stupidity and put a stop to it before something happened. The couple, lacking in knowledge of ursine ways, was highly indignant.

Bears have a human-like quality which is highly deceptive. They eat the same food as man, and many a bear in captivity has learned to guzzle beer and whiskey, dance to music, and perform tricks.

Voice From Past Tells Personal Courage Story

WASHINGTON (UPI) — About 9 p.m. on April 28, a Russian-born U.S. employee in a security-sensitive job returned to his apartment in suburban Washington. As he started to enter, he heard behind him a voice from the past. It was his brother whom he had last seen 23 years ago in Russia.

Thus began a story of personal terror and stolid courage which led Monday to expulsion from this country of a Soviet secret police agent masquerading as a cultural attaché at the Soviet Embassy.

The State Department demanded the "immediate departure" of attaché Gennadiy G. Sevastyanov, 33, accusing him of attempting to recruit for espionage a U.S. employee by threatening harm to his family in the Soviet Union.

U.S. officials identified the fe-

The voice behind him as he paused to enter his apartment was that of his brother, Volodya, who had been brought to the United States in a bizarre attempt to persuade him to spy for Russia.

Volodya suggested they talk in a car he had parked in the street, but John preferred the apartment and they entered. Volodya was evasive in explaining his presence, saying it had been "arranged."

Shortly, a man entered whom Volodya introduced as "Ivan Ivanovich," his driver. The driver was in fact Sevastyanov, an agent of the Committee for State Security, or KGB, Russia's secret police, and a member of the Soviet Embassy staff since March, 1959.

John's visitors departed after arranging a further talk. When they had gone, he quickly reported the encounter to the FBI, which advised him to continue the meetings. The next two meetings were secretly photographed by FBI agents.

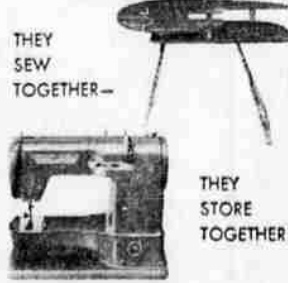
