The club president, Vi Mitterling, is attending the 42nd convention of Quota International at the Statler-Hilton Hotel in Los Angeles.

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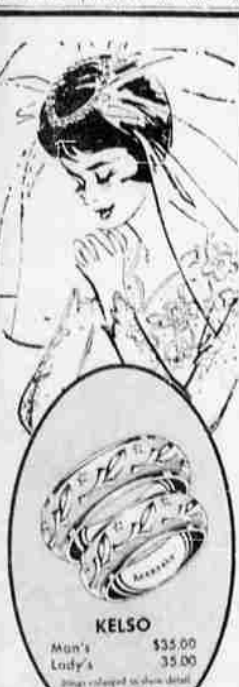
