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### Falcons Meet Ashland In Crucial Game Today

The Klamath Falcons, only two games away from a championship in the Southern Division of the American Legion, hopes to take a step nearer that goal today when they travel to Ashland to take on the recently rejuvenated Ashland nine in a conference contest at 1 p.m. The Klamath Hawks are at Grants Pass.

Coach John Paxton probably will go against Ashland with one of his aces, Gary Benson, and save the other, Rich Jackson, for Medford Tuesday. Both have fine records to their acclaim.

Steve Young or Tom Pilgrim are likely starters. Bob Woldt will be at first, Vern Petrick behind the plate, Roy Van Pelt or Jon Crume at second, Mac Cunningham or Young at short, Mike Spiker at third, Alan Kenyon, Rich Bath and Tom Schiff in the outfield. Curt Coleman may start either in the outfield or infield.

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (UPI) — Youthful Bobby Lund, riding a roller coaster of birdies and bogeys, battled through searing heat on weary legs Saturday to

defeat his San Francisco Bay area neighbor, Steve Opperman, one-up and win the National Public Links golf championship.

Lund, 18-year-old son of a San Francisco motorcycle policeman, thus became the 13th Californian to win the title in the 33-year history of the event.

### Pennel Tops Vault Mark, Put On Team

LONDON (UPI) — John Pennel of Northeast Louisiana State College regained the world pole vault record at the White City Stadium Saturday when he cleared 16 feet 8 1/2 inches in an international track and field meet.

Pennel, competing at the Amateur Athletic Association championships, made the clearance at his first attempt to surpass the record set by Brian Sternberg of the University of Washington.

Sternberg cleared 16 feet 8 inches at Compton, Calif., June 7.

### Candy Spots Defeats B. Major

CHICAGO (UPI) — Candy Spots outran B. Major in the final sixteenth Saturday after a head-and-head duel for nearly three-quarters of a mile to win the \$100,000 American Derby for three-year-olds by a length and a quarter.

The head-and-head duel between the odds-on Candy Spots, going off at 1 to 2, and the 4 to 1 B. Major on the sloppy track, brought the crowd of 25,508 to its feet for the prolonged struggle.

Candy Spots was timed at 2:02 2/5 for the mile and a quarter chase, excellent time on the sloppy surface which sent the mud splashing with every stride after a continuous 12-hour rain. The track record for the distance is 2:00 4/5.

### Early Wynn Finally Gets 300th

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI) — The 300th victory was a long time coming, but now that he has it, Early Wynn wants even more.

"You bet I want more — my next goal is 501," said the oldest player in baseball. "And I'd like to win about 10 more games this year."

Wynn, who has spent 23 of his 43 years as an American League pitcher, became the 14th player in the history of baseball to win 300 games Saturday. He pitched the Cleveland Indians to a 7-4 victory over the Kansas City Athletics in the second game of a doubleheader.

### Three Tie For Lead In Tourney

HOT SPRINGS, Ark. (UPI) — Mike Souchak, Rex Baxter Jr. and defending champion Al Johnston moved into a three-way tie Saturday for the third-round lead of the rain-plattered \$25,000 Hot Springs Open golf tournament.

### KF's Duncan, Humphrey Arrive In Japan

TOKYO (UPI) — Ten husky wrestling champions from Oregon high schools arrived in Japan Saturday for a series of nine meets with Japanese higher school grapplers.

Arriving with them at Tokyo international airport from Honolulu were coach and leader Delance Duncan of Klamath Falls High School; coach and manager John Dustin of Marshfield High School; Coos Bay; and Joe Much, reporter of the Salem Capital-Journal.

Clad in bright red jackets and dark blue trousers, the boys from Oregon attracted the attention of people at the terminal, either seeing off or waiting the arrival of friends.

Duncan and Dustin met Toshiyoshi Kubota, coach of the Tatebayashi Higher School wrestling team, who had taken an all-Japan higher school team of eight wrestlers to Oregon in January this year.

Koichi Endo, president of the All-Japan Higher Schools Wrestling Association who had taken the first Japanese team to the U.S. — California in 1961 — also greeted the Oregon contingent.

Kubota told UPI that his team had made a clean sweep of 18 meets last January in various Oregon cities but added, "The Oregon team which arrived today is an all-star affair, most of whom will be entering universities next fall. As such, I think we are going to see some very close matches."

"It's a great thing," Duncan said, "in the promotion of international understanding and friendship."

Smallest member of the Oregon team was Richard Henjyoji, 110 pounds, of Cleveland High School, Portland. A junior next fall, he is the son of Buddhist Bishop Daiyu Henjyoji of Portland.

The Oregonians will make their debut here on Monday at the Aoyama Wrestling Arena against an All-Japan (eastern Japan) pickup high school squad.

Members of the Oregon team besides Henjyoji were 120 pounds, Rick Sanders; 130 pounds, Grant Plack; 150 pounds, Don Dykstra; 160 pounds, Rollin Schimmel; 170 pounds, Fred Fozzard; 180 pounds, Henk Schenk; 190 pounds, Don Kauffman; and heavyweight Harold Weight.

SALEM — The Klamath Falls Falcons, conserving their energy in the Southern Division conference battle with Ashland today and with Medford Tuesday, dropped the first game to Salem's Capitol Post 9 Saturday, 3-2, before bouncing back in the second game to beat Silverton behind the two-hit pitching of Jim Jackson, 7-0.

The loss to Capitol Post 9 was a revenge win for that club. The Falcons dumped them in the Holiday Tournament at Gem Stadium, 4-3, in 12 innings. Jim Jackson was also the pitcher in that game but Gary Benson got the win in relief. Rich Grow was the loser Saturday in a fine pitching effort.

The Salem club won the game in the final inning. Lute Barnes, the Salem shortstop who also hit well in the last encounter, slammed a double. He went to third on a groundout and scored when the big nemesis of the Falcons, first sacker Walt Looney, belted a single. Looney tripled against the Falcons in the last contest.

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The track meet is open for all ages from boys 5 and up, and girls 6 and up. Anyone interested in competing should go to Modoc Field Tuesday and Thursday for the meets which begin at 5:30.

The Falcons were using their second line hurlers in Grow and Jackson, but both turned in fine performances. Coach John Paxton was saving his aces, Gary Benson and Rich Jackson, for the last two conference games which mean so much to the Falcons.
