Little League Ball Player Fatally Injured By Ball

JACKSON, Miss. (UPI) — A 1-year-old baseball player was fatally injured Thursday night when struck in the head by a baseball during a pre-game warmup.

Bruce Sloat, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. P. Sloat, died at Baptist Hospital two hours later of a possible brain hemorrhage.

Authorities said Sloat was the catcher for his "minor league" team and was struck in front of the ear by a ball that hit home plate and bounced.

L. S. Seward, league president, said the injury was not immediately apparent. Young Sloat grabbed the ball off the ground and "tossed the ball back to the pitcher and laughed."

The youngster then began rubbing his head and collapsed moments later.

Sloat was then rushed to Baptist Hospital in an ambulance. He died in the emergency room.

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
