## Brosterhous Sets Great Mark In Track Meet

Little Chris Brosterhous, a tousle-headed lass with a flair for running, turned in what might be one of the best times in the nation for a 9-10-year-old girl in the 440-yard dash Tuesday in one of the weekly segments of the Klamath Basin Athletic Association summer track program.

Chris was clocked in one minute, 19 1/2 seconds. That may sound pretty slow after hearing of the fantastic times set by college runners. But stop and consider that she is only in the 9-10-year-old group and that she is a girl; it really is something.

Her older brother, running in the 11-12-year-old group, was clocked only 1.9 seconds ahead of her. She beat her nearest competitor by 8.8 seconds. She beat the 11-12-year-old girl group winner by a second and a half and the 9-10 boy's group was won by Mark Wendt and she was two-tenths of a second ahead of him.

It isn't known how close this is to a national record and it probably couldn't be submitted for one anyway. But an attempt will be made to find out how close it is and publish it.

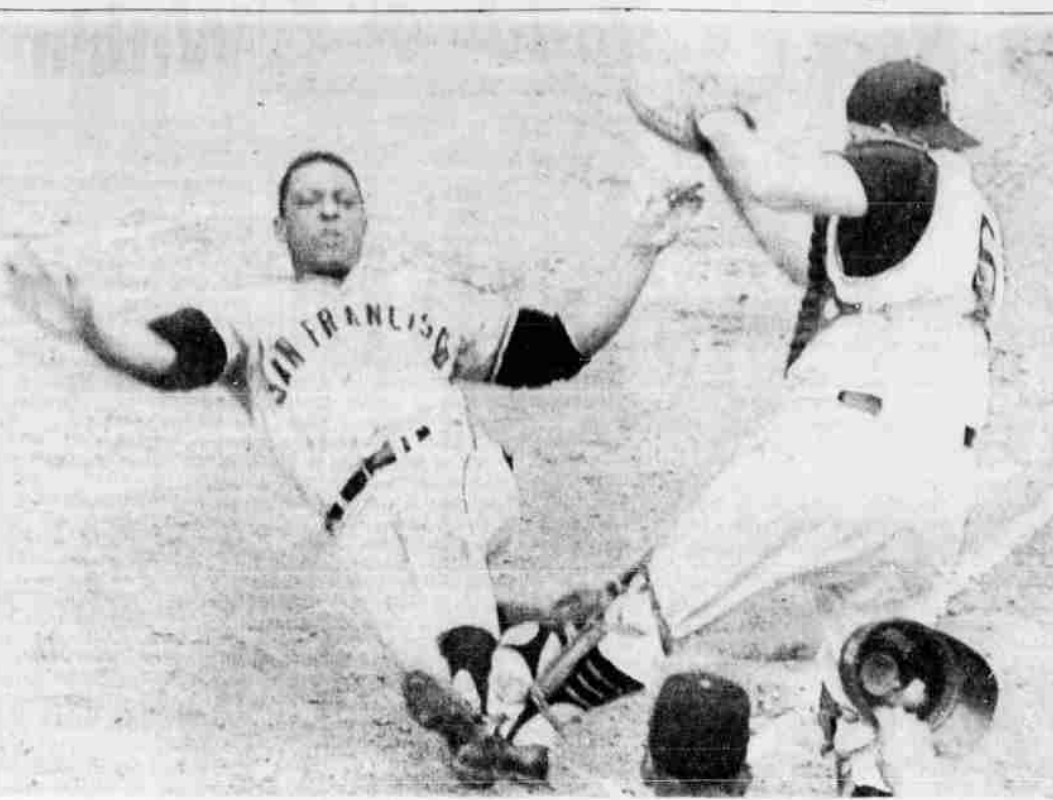
There were several good times. She also won the hurdles event and was better than the boys in that event also. She was clocked in a very fine 8.7 in the 50-yard hurdles. The 9-10 boys' winner was Don Diver in 9.0 flat. Her perfect day was almost ruined. She was tied for first in the 70-yard high hurdles, running in the 11 and over class, by Janis Narremore in 12.2.

Joe Petrotta continued his winning ways in the 6 and under boys' group when he won the 440-yard dash in 13.7 and the 440-yard dash in 1:42.7. He also won the dashes and the high jump.

Donette Zimmerman was tops in the 8 and under girls' group in the 50-yard hurdles in 11 flat and the 440-yard dash in 2:09.0. Debra Vroman was second to Miss Brosterhous in both the hurdles and dash.

Mark Holliday won the 7-8 boy's hurdles in 11.2 and Don River the 9-10 year group in 9.0. B. G. Brosterhous won the 11-12 boy's 70-yard hurdles in 11.3 and the 11-12 boy's 440-yard dash in 1:17.6. Nick Demetrakos won both the low and high hurdle events in the 13-14 boy's group. He topped the 70-yard high in 10.8 and the low in 9.6. Chuck Church won the 15-16 group high and low in 10 flat and 9.4.

The older boys' group found Ernie Badger capturing the 70-yard high in 9.5 while Monte Burnett was second. He was also second to Badger in the low in a winning time of 8.6. Burnett won the 440-yard dash with the best time of the day, 56.8. Church won the 15-16 group in 1:02.7 and Greg Brosterhous made it a near family sweep with a 1:04.9 timing in the 13-14 group and B. G. with his 1:17.6. John Brosterhous was second to Petrotta in the 6 and under group.

## Palmer Laughs Off Suggestion He May Get Complex Like Snead

DALLAS (UPI) — Favored Arnold Palmer laughed off the suggestions of his fellow pros today that if he doesn't win the PGA golf championship this week he may develop a defeatist complex which will keep him from ever capturing it.

"Maybe it's wishful thinking on their part," Palmer smiled. "At least, I haven't stayed awake nights worrying about it and I'm not likely to start. Of course, if I don't win it pretty soon I'm liable to start wondering if I ever will."

"But right now, I'm not worried. I'm worried more about my head cold and my driving."

The PGA, which starts Thursday over the 7,046-year heat-seared Dac Country Club course, is the only major title Palmer hasn't won. He has taken the Masters three times, the British Open twice and the U. S. Open once.

**Palmer Is Favorite**

Despite his poor showing in the British Open last week, Palmer is regarded as the man to beat in this 45th annual tournament for the nation's golf professionals.

"You never want to sell Palmer short," said big George Bayer, who thinks his chances on rolling course "are as good as anybody's."

"I see where a lot of the pros don't think that Palmer, Jack Nicklaus or Gary Player (the defending champion) can win this one," Bayer added, "all I can say is that any one of them can win any tournament they play in. I'm not saying one of the three will win here, but I wouldn't want to have to bet against them."

A lot of pros, who didn't want to be quoted for fear they might offend Palmer, said they thought that Palmer may develop a "Sam Snead complex" if he failed to win the PGA in his sixth try. Snead has won all the big ones except the U. S. Open and at 50, he isn't likely ever to win the one major tournament that isn't on his 112 tournament victory list.

**Same Thing Possible**

His fellow golfers insisted if Snead had not blown the Open on one of his first tries when he shot an eight on the final hole to lose out, he probably would have won a half dozen or more Opens.

And they feel that if Palmer doesn't finally shake his PGA jinx the same thing could happen to him in this tournament.

The starting field for Thursday was reduced to 167 with the withdrawal of Bill Casper, Cary Middlecoff, Toby Lyons, Sunday Horner and home pro Graham Ross. Casper and Middlecoff withdrew because of injuries — Casper with a bad hand which has kept him off the tour since May and Middlecoff because of a bad back.

The field will be cut to the low 75 and ties after Friday's second round for the final two rounds of play on Saturday and Sunday.

## Stu Young Hurls Medford To Second Win Over Locals

MEDFORD—Medford's American Legion baseball team took up the cry of an old-time ballplayer, Wee Willie Keeler, and "hit 'em where they ain't" to down the somewhat flat Klamath Falcons, 5-0, to send the Southern Division into a tie and playoff.

The playoff game will be a sudden death affair and will come off Thursday night in Gem Stadium at 8 p.m. That game will be for all the marbles. The winner of that game will be the league champion and will represent the Area 4 Southern Division in the playoffs. The winner will take on North Bend, the coast league winner, at a time and site yet undetermined.

This will be the big chance for the Falcons who, fortunately, get a second shot at it. They went into the Tuesday game at Medford with a game lead and needed the victory to sew up the league title. That never came about as crafty southpaw Stu Young set the Falcons down on four hits while striking 12 of them out.

Klamath's Rich Jackson suffered the defeat although he didn't pitch as badly as the 5-0 score indicates. He allowed only six hits during the game. But four of those six hits were doubles as the Medford players seemed to hit with radar in their bats to place the ball where the Falcon outfielders weren't. The Klamath batters who hit the ball weren't as fortunate.

It was the same old thing as usual which beat the Falcons. Their first few innings' jinx did the trick again Tuesday night. Medford scored twice in the first and three times in the second for the victory. That was all that Young, one of the finest hurlers in the state, needed.

The first two Falcon batters were quickly hit by Lanny Guyer slammed a wrong-field double to right which bounced over the fence for a ground rule two-bagger. He died there, however, as Mike Kitching whiffed.

Medford opened with Don Anderson grounding out to Jackson. Danny Miles then stroked another wrong-field double. An attempted pickoff at third base by catcher Jay Paxton went wild into the outfield and Miles scored. Miles was attempting the steal on the pitch which walked Mike Neathamer when Paxton threw wild to third. Neathamer tallied when Tom Barker laced a double between left and center field.

Young wasted no time on the Falcons in the second as he whiffed Parisotto, Paxton and Dave Johnson. Medford then came back with the three insurance runs for the final outcome. Ron Edmonds grounded out to LeVoy Young at shortstop and Mike Barnes drew a walk. Stu Young hit a ball just past Jackson but first sacker John Gray fielded the ball and then threw it wild past Jackson covering first and Barnes took third and Young galloped to second. Don Anderson hit a single to left and the speedy Young beat the throw home for the fourth run. Miles struck out but Neathamer belted another double off Jackson to right field which scored Anderson. He tried to stretch the double to a triple, however, and Johnson's toss to Lanny Guyer at second got him in a rundown between the bags and he was tagged out.

Neither team could score in the third although Medford had a man

## Bo Belinsky Reporting To Hawaii

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — "Bad boy" Bo Belinsky has ended nearly two months of seeking a career in movies or a night club interest and will attempt a return to the major leagues via the Hawaii Islands.

The Los Angeles Angels' pitcher refused to be sent down to the Angels' Pacific Coast League farm club May 25, so the Angels put him on the disqualified list without giving him any pay for as long as he didn't report.

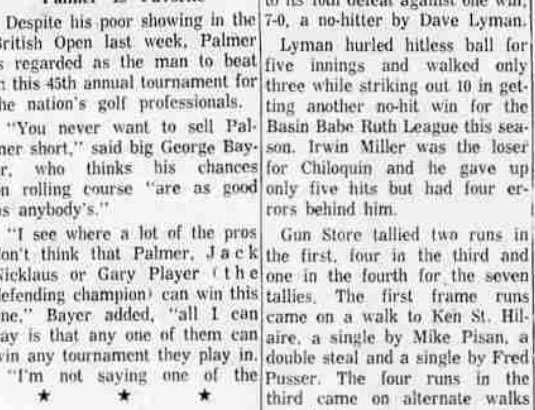
But the 26-year-old southpaw, whose lack of control on the mound early this season contributed to his woeful 1-7 record, conferred Monday with Angel general manager Fred Haney.

Haney announced that Belinsky would report to Hawaii Friday, adding, however, that he won't get paid until he shows that he is ready to pitch.

Belinsky, who pitched a no-hit game in his rookie year with the Angels in 1962, will probably have an opportunity to work for manager Irv Noren's Hawaii club.

The Islander staff has been so overworked lately that Noren, a first baseman-outfielder in his playing days with the Washington Senators and New York Yankees, has had to put himself in the lineup as a pitcher.

Belinsky, who made headlines from his earliest major league playing days with his off-field activities, talked about possibly making some movies after he was turned out by the Angels. When that fizzled, his lawyer, Paul Caruso, said, he was seeking an interest in a night club.

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**800,000 Trout To Be Planted**

SALEM (UPI) — About 800,000 trout will be air dropped into Oregon lakes in the next two weeks, the Oregon Game Commission said today.

Most will be two to three-inch eastern brook and rainbow trout. A few lakes will get some golden trout.

Operations have already started from the Klamath fish hatchery. About 50 lakes in the southern Cascades and a few in the Siskiyou will be bombed with fish from that source.

About 300 lakes will be planted at a cost of \$20 per lake, a commission spokesman said.

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
