

Suit Filed Against Policeman

A Portland man filed a civil suit in the Klamath County Clerk's Office Tuesday citing that he was the victim of an unprovoked attack by a Klamath Falls policeman following his arrest on a charge of disorderly conduct June 7.

The plaintiff in the suit is Marvin Andrews who is seeking \$3,407 in damages, including \$2,500 exemplary damages, \$7 for medical treatment, and \$900 general damages, from police officer Jack H. Redfield, 1421 Esplanade.

At the time of the incident, Andrews had been temporarily residing in Klamath Falls before returning to Portland.

The suit charges that officer Redfield, without provocation, used his fists to strike Andrews several times about the face and head following the latter's arrest on the disorderly conduct charge. It also states that Andrews in "no way resisted arrest" and that "he submitted peacefully" to officers when taken into custody.

The suit states specifically that subsequent to Andrews' arrest officer Redfield called his prisoner a "dirty little nigger SOB" and "grabbed him by the back of the neck when he was in no way resisting."

Andrews was placed in the police paddy wagon and transferred to the city jail where he was lodged in the drunk tank. At that time, officer Redfield struck Andrews on the mouth, forehead, cheek and behind the ear, knocking him down, the suit charges.

As a result of the assault and battery, the complaint states that Andrews suffered "human indignities," facial injuries and, in addition, the attack "aggravate a pre-existing condition to his right eye."

Andrews alleges that "the assault was willful, malicious, vicious, violent, without cause or provocation and completely outside of Redfield's rights as a police officer."

Andrews was also cited for vagrancy but that charge was dismissed in municipal court where he was ordered to pay a \$50 fine or serve 10 days in jail. He elected to pay \$50 and served two days in the city jail.

Auto Sales At 4 Million

DETROIT (UPI)—Ward's Automotive Reports said today automotive dealers sold 177,427 domestic new cars during the first 10 days of the month.

The sales swelled to 3,953,000 auto sales for the calendar year. The statistical agency said the four millionth new car of the calendar year was sold July 13. In record 1955 the four millionth car was sold July 10.

During the period the average daily sales rate was 22,178 units, 9.6 per cent above last year and the second highest daily rate for the period in history. In 1955 the daily rate for the period was 23,858.

General Motors grabbed 53.8 per cent of the sales during the first 10 days of July, Ford 24.4 per cent, Chrysler 14.7 per cent, American Motors 6.2 per cent and Studebaker .9 per cent.

Experiment Under Sea

NICE, France (UPI)—Andre Portelaine, one of the members of Cmdr. Jacques-Yves Cousteau's recent 20-day experiment in living under the Red Sea, said Tuesday he ate and slept as though he were at home.

City Authorizes Purchase Of Cleaning Equipment

The Klamath Falls City Council has authorized the purchase of sewer cleaning equipment, as proposed by City Manager Bob Kyle, but it is lukewarm to another proposal by the city manager that the city acquire a four-wheel drive vehicle, equipped with fire-fighting apparatus, to combat grass fires which may break out on some of the barren hills within the city limits.

Its view notwithstanding, the council requested Kyle to obtain estimates of the cost of the fire-fighting equipment and then report his findings to the group sometime later, it developed at the city council meeting Monday.

The city manager made his recommendation for the purchase of the new vehicle, to be equipped with a 200-gallon water tank and pump operated by a 7½ horsepower engine, on the basis that the city has no equipment to fight a fire which "occurs off of the pavement."

"We have engines that operate on paved streets, but nothing capable of operating on the side of a hill," he said.

Kyle reported that the Klamath Forest Protective Association has indicated it would construct the 200-gallon water tank for the truck if the purchase is approved.

The council doubted that the unit could be set up before the end of the fire season but authorized Kyle to obtain prices on the equipment with the provision that it would not be obligated to accept any of the bids.

The council was more receptive to the purchase of equipment to clean the city's sewers which are becoming clogged with "muck, grass and silt," Kyle stated.

He estimated that approximately one-third of the city's 97 miles of 14-inch diameter sewer lines contain from four to five inches of sediment.

"The muck reduces the efficiency of the sewer system, which will continue to fill up until some-

thing is done about it," Kyle remarked. He estimated that the equipment would cost from \$4,800 to \$5,000.

It was suggested that sewer cleaning apparatus could be rented to the South Suburban Sanitary District whenever needed by that district.

On another matter, the council approved a request to replace two 4,000 watt incandescent street

lights with 7,000 watt mercury vapor lights at Fremont Street and Eldorado Avenue and authorized the establishment of another 7,000 watt lamp at the same site. It further approved a recommendation that two incandescent lamps near the city shops at Spring Street be replaced with the mercury lamps and that a similar lamp be set up at the rear of the building.
