

Actor Takes Part In Integration

CAMBRIDGE, Md. (UPI) — Actor Marlon Brando told integration leaders in this racially torn Maryland community today that he would join in their demonstrations here in defiance of a National Guard ban.

Brando, in a telephone conversation with Negro leaders, said he would arrive here by Saturday.

Despite the ban against demonstrations under state militia law, imposed Friday, the Negro leaders announced that they would state two more demonstrations this afternoon and evening.

There had been speculation that integration leaders would suspend the demonstrations until Brig. Gen. George M. Gelston, commander of about 450 National Guard troops sent here to enforce militia law, returned to Cambridge.

Gelston left the city this morning after being notified that his mother had died.

Earlier today, a group of about 100 whites gathered in front of the Cambridge Armory to protest the release Monday night of 14 Negroes arrested for demonstrating in defiance of the imposed ban.

The demonstrators arrested included Gloria Richardson, head of the Cambridge Non-Violent Action Committee, and Stanley Branche, an NAACP field director.

Sun Eclipse Draws Crowd

BAR HARBOR, Maine (UPI) — Thousands were pouring into this fashionable seaside resort this week for front row seats Saturday to nature's most spectacular sky show, the total eclipse of the sun.

The visitors, ranging from scientists to schoolboys and tourists to tradesmen, were lining up covered sites to watch the awesome phenomenon of the moon passing between the sun and the earth.

The nearby plateau-like summit of 1,532-foot Cadillac Mountain, highest Atlantic Coast elevation between here and Argentina, offered a perfect vantage point of the spectacle that will turn day into night.

The total eclipse will be seen a 60-mile-wide swath from Japan,

across the North Pacific to Alaska, Canada and Maine before ending in the Atlantic at sunset.

The celestial event will be observed as a partial eclipse elsewhere in the Northern Hemisphere and as far south as Venezuela.

At 5:47 p.m., EDT, the moon will block out the sun entirely over this area. The air temperature may drop; stars will be visible, and the sudden darkness will trick nocturnal insects and animals into stirring prematurely.

Twenty special astronomical expeditions will be perched atop Cadillac Mountain. These range from a high altitude research group from Boulder, Calif., to a high school science group from

New Jersey. Astronaut M. Scott Carpenter plans to fly over Maine at 42,000 feet in a specially equipped plane. A scientist accompanying him on the flight will point out to him scientific aspects of the eclipse which astronauts may encounter in future space journeys.
