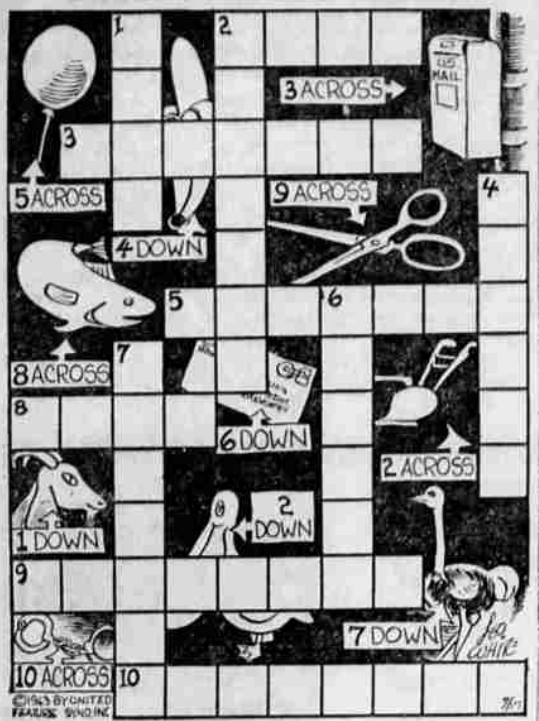

Federal Judge Says FBI Must End 'Harassment'

CHICAGO (UPI) — A federal judge today ordered the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to stop its "harassment" of Sam (Mooney) Giancana, reputed boss of the Chicago Crime Syndicate. Federal District Court Judge Richard B. Austin also placed Martin W. Johnson, chief FBI agent in Chicago, in contempt of court for refusing to answer questions in court.

Giancana, an international playboy who is reputed to have direct control over vice and gambling in Chicago, was in court as he won his victory over the FBI. His saturnine face was dour as the judge began speaking, but it brightened steadily as Austin laced into the FBI for its "rough shadowing" techniques and refusal to withdraw a small corps of agents from around the mobster's suburban home.

"I know there are some not interested in civil rights and not concerned with privacy who will in the future approve of this type of harassment," Austin said. "I cannot give my sanction. This conduct, if it were by private citizen, would be actionable in court."

In a preliminary injunction, Austin even spelled out how close the FBI can get to Giancana on the golf course. Giancana had complained that a foursome of FBI agents dogged his heels whenever he went onto the links. Austin said the FBI golfers would have to let another foursome intervene between them and Giancana.

The judge also ordered that the FBI could post only one car in its stakeout at Giancana's home and stipulated that it would have to stay a block away from the residence. Giancana, often accused of playing fast and loose with the law, had attacked the FBI on grounds that his civil rights were being violated. He hired one of Chicago's top civil rights attorneys, George N. Leighton, to plead his case. Leighton's specialty is the pleading of Negro civil rights cases.

Court Orders Negro Vote Approval

The U.S. Court of Appeals acted with an unusual degree of urgency in ordering a Mississippi voting registrar to put 45 Negroes on the registration list and to stop discriminating against other Negroes who want to vote.

The appeals court—with judges from Texas, Louisiana and Georgia acting unanimously — told Forrest County (Hattiesburg) registrar Theron Lynd to comply with its orders within 10 days or face a trip to prison. Other phases of his case are pending.

It is highly unusual for a federal court specifically to order individuals to be registered for voting. In the only recent case like it, a U.S. court handed down a similar order for a larger group of Negro registrants in Montgomery, Ala.

"Most Unusual"
The appeals court also said in the Lynd case that it was "most unusual" for that court to hand down an injunction as it did on a temporary basis in the Lynd case.

The appellate court said it took the action so that the rights of the Negroes involved might be protected while the federal district court conducts a full hearing on a Justice Department request for an injunction against the Hattiesburg registrar. The lower court had earlier refused to grant the injunction.

Civil rights voting cases are expected to become increasingly prominent between now and the 1964 presidential election as Negro organizations step up pledges to "double the Negro registration."

Negro groups are finding the way fairly easy in some sections of the South. It is more difficult

in others. Their problem is both opposition from "the courthouse crowd" in rural areas and lethargy on the part of Negroes.

Shows Slight Increase
Latest figures available from the U.S. Civil Rights Commission and the Voter Education Project (VEP), a get-out-the-Negro-vote drive financed by the Taconic Foundation, show only a

slight increase in Negro registration between 1960 and 1962. A spokesman for the VEP says Mississippi's Negro registration is about 25,000, roughly what it was in 1960 and 1962. That's the low point for the South. There are 422,356 voting-age Negroes in Mississippi, according to most recent figures.

The Lynd decision affects an area of the nation where there has been a running account of alleged voter discrimination and violence against Negroes working for voting privileges.

Alabama, with about 70,000 registered Negroes from a voting age Negro population of 481,320, is next to the bottom.

Plane Contract Criticized

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Sen. Karl E. Mundt, R-S.D., said in Senate testimony made public today that he got the impression that Navy Secretary Fred Korth had a "predisposition toward General Dynamics" Corp. before the TFX fighter plane contract was awarded.

Korth emphatically denied the inference. He said he resented Mundt's characterization of him as "Mr. General Dynamics" and "Mr. Ft. Worth."

The exchanges were part of transcripts made public today of closed-door testimony taken by the Senate Permanent Investigations subcommittee in the disputed multi-billion dollar TFX contract case.

Chairman John L. McClellan, D-Ark., introduced a letter from the Bureau of Naval Weapons dated July 9 saying the charts were "somewhat controversial and before they are used, the risks involved should be appreciated."

"There was no question but that this option would have been selected," the letter said. "The major advantage of General Dynamics in this area (speed and altitude) then disappears."

McClellan sharply questioned why Korth presented the chart to the panel showing a "distorted" view when he was aware it was not accurate.

Korth said the Oct. 19 progress report of Boeing had never been evaluated. He contended it involved a "major redesign" of the plane and was submitted after the competition closed.
