

Vandalism Investigated By Police

City police are investigating two acts of vandalism that occurred in the past three days, one at the First Federal Bank, 34 Main Street, at 5:41 p.m. Sunday, and the other at the Klamath County Library, Monday at about 12:25 a.m.

Bank officials estimated \$1,000 damage was caused when someone fired a rifle shot through the bank window that also pierced a curtain and entered the ceiling.

City police found an empty cartridge outside the building and dug the bullet slug out of the ceiling. A witness who saw the shooting wrote down the license number of the car as the vehicle sped away. Police indicate there is a suspect in the case.

Betty Cote, county librarian, told police three teen-age boys pulled fixtures off the men's restroom at the library Monday afternoon. Mrs. Cote gave descriptions of the youths to the police, but there are no suspects. No estimates of the damage were immediately available.

Board Picks Delegates

LAKEVIEW—An organizational meeting of the new advisory board for the Lakeview District of the Bureau of Land Management was held Monday, July 8, and delegates were selected to attend the state advisory board meeting in Baker, July 16-17.

Although the procedure of nomination and election was changed to a mailed ballot this year, all the old members were reelected. The cattle representatives are Benben Long, Fort Rock, chairman; Con Lynch, Lakeview, vice chairman; Henry Gerber, Bonanza; George Elder, Lakeview, and Terence Cahill, Adel.

In addition, two sheep representatives were added, Ben O'Keefe of Silver Lake and Jeremiah O'Leary of Paisley. T. R. Conn of Lakeview is the wildlife representative appointed by the state director.

The delegates chosen for the state board meeting are Gerber as cattle representative, with Lynch as alternate, and O'Keefe as sheep representative, with O'Leary as alternate. Gerber is chairman of the state board.

Also attending the meeting were Conn and George Lea, district BLM manager.

School Day Made Longer

DUNSMUIR—The school day will be lengthened at the Dunsmuir Elementary School this fall and shop and art classes will be curtailed at the junior high level for greater emphasis on academic subjects, the school board has announced.

School will begin at 8:55 a.m. and dismiss at 3:35 p.m. with a 45-minute lunch hour adding 25 minutes to the school day. Paul Lewis, science teacher, will teach shop as an elective subject and Helen Marske, art teacher, will also teach literature courses this fall.

Afternoon as well as morning kindergarten classes have been approved by the board due to a heavy pre-registration of students.

An increase in California School Board Association dues was protested by the board at the July meeting. Dues, now \$108, have shown a steady increase. Dr. H. A. Meredith said, and the board secretary was authorized to ask for an explanation.

The August board meeting was set for Aug. 6 at 7:30 p.m. in the school library. The annual public budget hearing will be held at this meeting and gasoline bids for school bus use will be opened. Gerald Spencer is the newly elected chairman of the Dunsmuir Elementary School Board and Will Ellington is the newly elected clerk. At the June meeting, Jack Samuelson and Neal Kluckman, retiring board members, were recognized for their service.
