



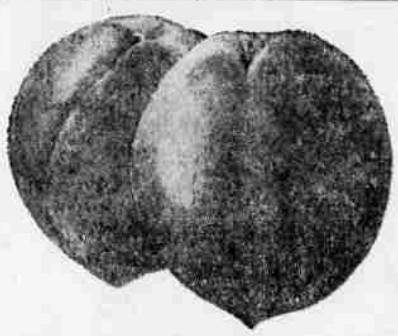

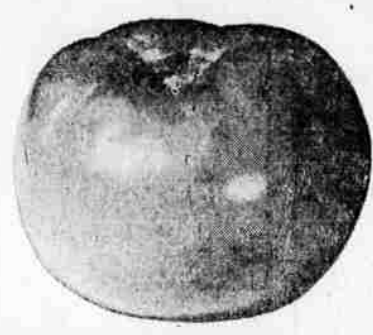

Circle 'Round
With Brownies

Summertime square dancers develop hearty appetites and welcome energy food that tastes good and is different. So give them rectangles of coconut ice cream placed on top of semi-sweet brownies. Then, just for good measure, sprinkle a little toasted coconut on top of the ice cream.

After eating that, they can dance till dawn.

SEMI-SWEET BROWNIES
(6 Servings)
2-3 cup sifted flour
1/2 teaspoon double-acting baking powder
1/4 teaspoon salt
1-3 cup butter or other shortening
1 package (6 ounces) glazed semi-sweet chocolate chips

1/4 cup granulated sugar
2 eggs, well beaten
1/2 cup broken California walnuts
1 teaspoon vanilla
Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt, and sift again. Melt shortening and 1/2 package of the chocolate chips over hot water. Gradually add sugar to eggs, beating thoroughly. Add chocolate mixture and blend. Add flour and mix well; then add walnuts and vanilla. Spread batter in greased 8-inch square pan. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) about 25 minutes. Sprinkle the remaining 1/2 package chocolate chips over top; bake five minutes longer. Cool in pan. Then cut into rectangles. Top with Toasty Coconut-Topped Ice Cream Squares.

MARKET BASKET

PROTEIN IN FOODS
Turkey, now a popular year-around bird, is being sold at bargain prices—sometimes as low as 29 cents per pound. Priced a little higher and particularly good for barbecuing are the Beltsville turkeys weighing from 4 to 8 pounds. Also, especially featured to attract the picnic and barbecuing crowd are boneless turkey and cut-up turkey pieces.

The forecast is for a slight increase in beef prices as the price to the wholesaler is increasing. This increase will probably show up first in steaks with pot roasts and other longer-cooking cuts of beef remaining about the same.

This is a good time for salmon lovers to eat their fill of this delicious Northwest fish. The silver salmon are plentiful and an excellent buy. Silvers, either the half or whole fish, range in price from 49 cents to 69 cents. Charcoal broiled salmon is a real treat for those summer visitors. Tender little Oregon shrimp are in short supply. Reports say the catch is "off," and fishermen are having a difficult time finding good quality shrimp.

FRUITS
Cherries, mostly coming from Hood River and The Dalles, are excellent but the price is rather high. However, the price of cherries will not be dropping much this year because of the short crop caused by weather damage and the late season. Mother Nature's ups and downs will also mean smaller Oregon pear, plum and peach crops.

Strawberries are really past their peak, and size and quality are reduced. Local raspberries are generally very good. The raspberry season is all too short, so enjoy these flavorful berries while they are plentiful.

July is apricot month. Washington grown 'cots are coming in now, and these plump, golden fruits are a signal that summer is in full swing. Principal varieties are Moorpark, Tilton and Blenheim. All varieties are excellent for canning and freezing, and are easy to preserve for out of season enjoyment. Prices are still a bit high.

VEGETABLES
To take the "summer out of summer" serve a cool crisp salad made with Oregon grown greens. Romaine, butter, head and leaf lettuces are plentiful and low priced, as are radishes and green onions.

Weather has hurt local cabbage and its cousin the cauliflower. As a result more California cabbage and cauliflower are on the market—good quality but a little higher priced.

Yellow crook-neck squash and zucchinis are plentiful and low in price. First local green and wax beans are starting. They make a pleasant menu change.

When buying a dress try to select one that is of good quality. A plain fabric with subdued texture and no design is a wise choice. Select a weight fabric that is suitable to almost any season.
