Three Hurt In Mishaps

Three Klamath Falls residents received cuts and bruises and were treated at the Klamath Valley Hospital after two car accidents, Wednesday and Thursday, investigated by the Klamath Falls Police Department.

Two of the injured received head cuts after their heads smashed into the car windshields.

Injured were passengers, Randall Rowland, 15, 1436 Canby Street, cuts on forehead; Sammy Gordon, 64, Commercial Rooms, cuts and bruises, and Edward Williams, 41, Pelican Hotel, head cuts.

In Wednesday's two-car crash, a car driven by Wendell A. Smith, 50, 1335 Eldorado Avenue, collided with a vehicle driven by Mitchell Harden, 19, 523 South Eighth Street, at the intersection of South Ninth and Walnut streets. Rowland and Gordon were passengers in the Harden car.

Police cited Smith for failing to yield the right of way to another vehicle. Both vehicles received moderate damage.

Thursday's crash was a one-car accident in which a vehicle belonging to Raymond L. Olson, Route 1, Klamath Falls, and driven by an unknown person, slammed into a house at 332 Washington Street, owned by William Canton. The car received major damage and damage to the house was moderate.

Witnesses spotted the driver and a woman passenger run from the scene without leaving their names and addresses, and Edward Williams, one of the passengers was taken to Klamath Valley Hospital with head cuts. The accident occurred at 4:30 p.m.

New Freeway Opens July 26

SALEM (UPI)—A new freeway project between Medford and Ashland featuring Oregon's first concrete highway built without joints will open July 26.

The nearly 10 miles of new road is between Barnett Road in Medford and the North Ashland interchange.

It will connect with an existing completed section of freeway which ends just south of the Medford viaduct.

State Highway Engineer Forrest Cooper said completion of the new units means motorists will have an uninterrupted freeway for 43 miles starting on the north near Sexton Mountain north of Grants Pass.

The continuous strip concrete in the road is believed to be the longest such construction in the nation.

Heavier steel reinforcement was used in the concrete pavement eliminating the need for cross joints. The state normally saws joints across a concrete highway every 66 feet.

Minors Break Liquor Laws

PORTLAND (UPI)—Oregon liquor law violations involving sales to minors rose 23 per cent during the first six months of 1963, an Oregon Liquor Control Commission hearing supervisor said Thursday.

H. J. Detloff said in his semi-annual report that licenses were charged with 417 violations involving minors, 23 per cent higher than the total for the preceding six months.

Violations based on sales to minors were 193 per cent higher than in a similar period four years ago, he said.

There were 734 violations of all kinds reported in the six-month period, Detloff said.

however. The first recorded incident of its being served tells of an ingenious French chef surprising his master, the Duc de Chartres, with ice cream for his dinner one night in 1774. The story does not credit the Duc's chef with its creation, so its origin remains a mystery.

Neither can a later Duc de Chartres be credited with introducing ice cream to this country. The young French prince, grandson of Louis Philippe, did come to America to serve on the staff of the Federal Army during the Civil War, but by that time Dolly Madison has influenced history by making the velvety con-

coction a White House specialty. Historians have analyzed President Madison as a profound thinker and a dominate maker of foreign policy. But scholarly though the good president was, he was a fractious man with no personal charm whatever—a man who antagonized and alienated his visitors and associates.

The disposition of his North Carolina born wife was the exact opposite to his. Mrs. Madison is still considered to have been the gayest, most gracious first lady who ever adorned the White House. Historians can't know how many hot tongues were cooled and bitter animosities averted when

lovely Dolly flashed her husband's important guests a warm smile as she handed them a cold dish of her famous ice cream.

When its occupants fled the White House during the War of 1812, Dolly Madison—practical, too—saved much of the valuable silver and many important papers. It's easy to imagine that she hastily popped her favorite ice cream recipes into her capacious poke and took them along too.

As late as 1850, ice cream was an uncommon delicacy, reserved for wealthy citizens who lived in the great mansions. But the country's farmers who filled their block houses with winter ice for

er they, too, could have ice cream. They figured it wasn't much more trouble to make than most desserts, even though the container of mix, set into a tub of chopped ice and salt, had to be stirred constantly with a paddle until the ice cream was frozen. Then in 1843, another lady, Nancy M. Johnson of Philadelphia, patented her first home ice cream freezer. The ones in use today retain virtually the same design though in these automated times, some are electrically powered.

Our babies learn to cry for "cream cones" before they can say "Mama." It's incredible that

so short a time ago as the middle of the last century ice cream was a suspicious novelty and children had to be coaxed to try it.

An old cook book tells of three little girls who pooled their fortune, a handful of pennies, to buy one dish of strawberry ice cream impaled with three spoons. When they tasted it, they were so disappointed that leaving the pink mound to melt to strawberry soup, they ran from the soda fountain, sobbing because their pennies were gone.

The first soda fountain in Klamath Falls, according to Rachel Applegate Good's "History of Klam-

ath County" was in the old Chitwood Drug Store which stood in 1899 very near the present Veterans Memorial Park on the corner now bearing the address 66 Main Street.

Maybe early Klamath Falls children pooled their small fortunes to buy ice cream at Chitwood's. Old-timers say they remember stirring down to the soda fountain on warm summer evenings for a cooling treat.

Research material asserts flatly that ice cream is scarcely obtainable in European and other foreign capitals, and is penetrating those cities slowly in response

to the demands of traveling Americans. Andy Collier of Klamath Falls states just as flatly, "Not so." He has recently returned from a trip to Africa where he ate in cities in Ethiopia, Kenya, Egypt and other "foreign capitals," and he says he was served excellent ice cream nearly everywhere he went.

Whatever the ice cream situation in other countries, it's far and away America's most popular dessert.

Basinities may eat vanilla ice cream, made just as it has been ever since Nancy Johnson invented her bleep-bucking freezer, at Veterans Memorial Park, Sunday, July 28.
