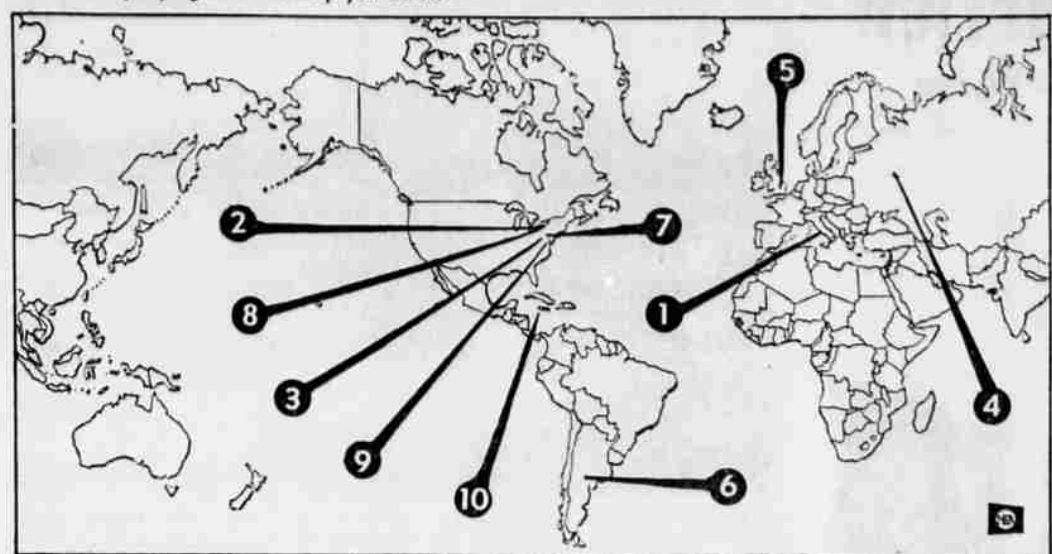


WHAT AND WHERE?..... A New News game for readers

Voice Of General MacArthur Preserved On Record

EDITOR'S NOTE: The writer of this dispatch served as a private in Gen. Douglas MacArthur's southwest Pacific forces during World War II. As a UPI correspondent nearly two decades later, he covered MacArthur's sentimental return to the Philippines.

MANILA (UPI)—The voice of Gen. Douglas A. MacArthur as it sounded during his sentimental pilgrimage to the Philippines in 1961 now is preserved for posterity.

A Manila recording company is introducing a long-playing record of the major speeches MacArthur delivered during his visit. The old soldier's name long has been engraved in bronze. Now his voice, called dramatic by many listeners, has been etched in plas-

tic. A Philippine company recently manufactured one of the first commercial documentary recordings ever cut in Southeast Asia. For its pioneering platter, the company selected the voice of a man who, among foreigners, is a hero without peer in the Philippines.

The MacArthur voice, skilled in elocution, speaks again from record players of Philippine and American soldiers who fell in battle.

"My thoughts go back to those who went with us to their last campaign. I do not know the dignity of their birth, but I do know the glory of their death."

"Their flags will wave again only in the evening of our memory. Under white crosses in chambered temples of silence, the dust of their faultless valor rests—

waiting, waiting in the Chancellery of Heaven, the final reckoning of Judgment Day. Never will I forget."

Selection of MacArthur's voice for this Philippine experiment in long-playing records makes sense. Just out of West Point in the early 1900's, MacArthur served his early military duty in the Philippines.

Before Pearl Harbor, he was a field marshal in the Philippine Army, a rank probably never held by any other American soldier.

He commanded at Bataan and Corregidor in the dark days of the Pacific War, and he fulfilled his pledge, "I shall return."

The name MacArthur is engraved on a bridge in the center of Manila. His name lines a highway which winds from his Linayen Gulf beachhead into Manila where thousands of Filipinos

and Americans perished in streets and dungeons before his return.

The MacArthur platter was cut from tapes recorded during his revisit to Philippine battlefields in July 1961. Now 83 years old, MacArthur said his 1961 trip probably would be his last across the Pacific.

From the record's plastic grooves, he describes in a voice choked with emotion the Pacific War which his troops knew:

"Those boiling suns of relentless heat. Those torrential rains of devastating storms. The loneliness and utter desolation of jungle trials. The ghastly horror of stricken areas."

"The slime of murky foxholes. The stench of ghostly trenches. The mire of dripping dugouts. Paint blues blowing reveille. The crash of guns. The rattle of musketry."

Buddy Greco Hit Big Time After Small-Time Series

NEW YORK (UPI)—One night club entertainer who claims he doesn't get upset by talkative, noisy audiences is Buddy Greco, a popular singing stylist who came up through a long series of small-time spots to the big clubs and the big money.

"Fortunately," said the 36-year-old Greco, "I find most of my audiences these days attentive. But when I do run into an occasional noisy gathering, I feel it's my job to keep right on performing without throwing a tantrum, as some entertainers do. I've seen some of them stomp off a floor in a huff. Not me."

"I spent too many years working in cocktail lounges where audiences are always noisy and inattentive to let a thing like that bother me."

Greco's cocktail lounge career was spent as a singer who accompanied himself on the piano. When he graduated to the big clubs, such as the Copacabana here, he simply abandoned the piano and became a stand-up singer.

"For 15 years, I worked in cocktail lounges and the like, and I learned that the only way to cope with audience noise is just to make believe that there is no noise and to play and sing merrily. If it is possible to get their attention at all, that is the way to do it."

"Although I'm happy to be out of the cocktail lounges, I do appreciate that they gave me an invaluable experience. A performer cannot light an audience. He must just keep on trying to do his best to please those who want to listen. And you must believe that things will be better the next show."

Maps Elaborate Show

The National Repertory Theater has mapped an elaborate national tour to start in October and continue through next June. Twenty cities will be covered from coast to coast.

"The Seagull" is one of them, and she also will direct and play the role of Madame Arcandine.

The other plays are Jean Anouilh's "Ring Around the Moon" and Arthur Miller's "The Crucible."

Granger will portray Constantine in "The Seagull," the twins in Anouilh's comedy and the Reverend Hale in Miller's drama. Miss Meacham will be Nina in the Chekhov, Lady India in the Anouilh and Elizabeth Proctor in the Miller.

Plans call for each of the three plays to get at least two performances in a normal eight-performance week. Among the major cities that will figure in the tour are Boston, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, Los Angeles, St. Louis, Washington and Wilmington.

Edith Piaf Back

Edith Piaf, the notable French chanteuse who achieved great popularity here in the late 1940's and early 1950's, will be back for a limited engagement beginning Oct. 3 at the Mark Hellinger Theater. There will be some other performers with her to make up a sort of revue, and one of them will be her husband, singer Theo Sarapo.

Piaf has had a series of illnesses in recent years, accounting for the fact that she hasn't appeared in this country for a long time. She also will play in Washington, Montreal, San Francisco, Toronto, Boston, Chicago, Detroit, Quebec and Ottawa.

TV NOTES

A year ago Vaughn Meader, almost unknown, appeared on the first "Talent Scouts" program of the summer as a performer. The impact of his impersonation of President Kennedy shot him to success. Meader will be back on the program on CBS July 2 when it starts another summer replacement engagement. This time he will be a "scout," introducing an unknown.

Polly Bergen Goes To Pics

HOLLYWOOD (UPI)—Hang on to your old Polly Bergen albums—they might become collector's items.

Blue-eyed beautiful Polly has quit singing to devote all her time to acting in movies. No more night clubs, no more recording sessions, no more warbling for television.

It's a big jump for a girl who became famous as a panelist on a video show titled "To tell the Truth."

But when audiences see Polly star as a mental case in "The Caretakers," they are liable to forget all about her career as a songbird and television cutie.

As if to prove her versatility, the black-haired, fair-skinned doll plays it for laughs with Jim Garner and Doris Day in "Move Over, Darling," and will follow that up with another top role playing the first female president of the United States in "Kisses for My President."

Polly's reason for altering her career is simple. She was a long way from being the best singer in the country, and she believes

there is a good chance for her to become the best actress.

"If there is a chance of my being great at anything it lies in the direction of drama," she explained at 20th Century-Fox.

"I've always wanted to be with the greats, or among the greats. And I had no chance to become a really great, memorable singer. At first I was merely a television personality, which leaves no room for greatness at all."

The Irish beauty thought she was on her way several years ago when she won an Emmy Award for her role in "The Helen Morgan Story," a video milestone.

But it was a false start. "After I won the award people still thought of me as a singer," she said. "The Emmy didn't mean that much to the big shots who make movies. Now things are different."

"The Caretakers" hasn't been released yet, but a lot of producers have seen it. Now, everybody seems to want me for movies, but last year when things were slow nobody did."
