18. At a crowded party, a girl may accept a boy's LIP or back talk rather than argue. She would expect him to get up and offer his seat rather than his LAP.

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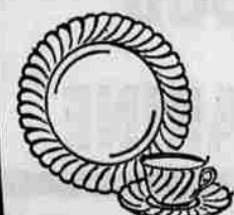


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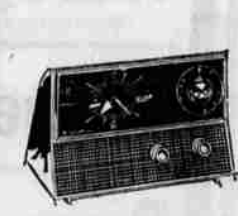
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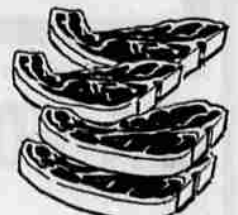
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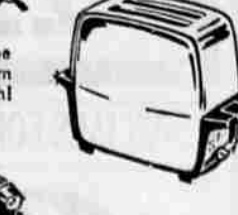
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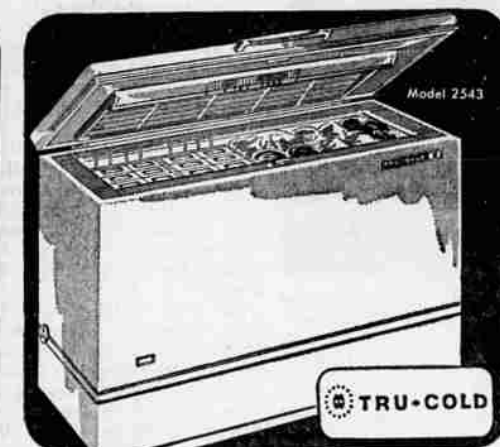
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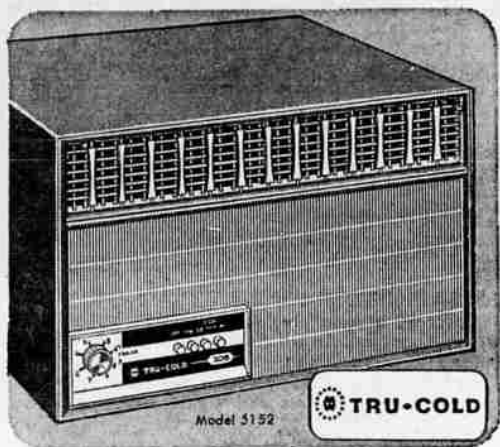
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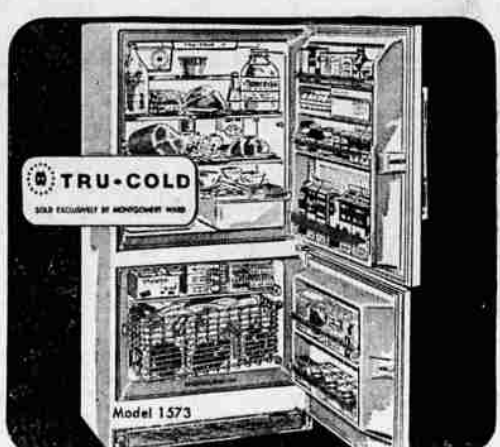
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Huge Libel Suit Filed

PORTLAND (UPI) — A \$200,000 libel suit was filed here Friday by a Portland Negro against City Commissioner Stanley Earl.

It claimed William Roy Carr, a former city fireman, was unjustly named as a thief in a statement made by Earl Wednesday that the city once employed a Negro fireman "but he stole some equipment and we let him go."

The suit said that Carr was the only Negro ever employed as a city fireman. It claimed the statement was false and defamatory and "tended to expose the plaintiff to public hatred, contempt and ridicule."

Carr, who worked for the Portland Fire Bureau from 1932 to 1957, seeks \$100,000 general damages and \$100,000 punitive damages.

Campus Belles Club Organized

MOUNT SHASTA — Campus Belles is the name of a newly formed club in Mount Shasta. Its sole purpose is to furnish at least one \$100 scholarship annually to College of the Siskiyous to a qualified senior girl and to entertain senior girls annually with a banquet in May. Membership consists of all women interested in furthering the education of today's youth.

The nucleus of the club is former members of the dissolved B.P.W. of Mount Shasta. There are 15 members at present. Any woman wishing to participate is asked to contact Mrs. Jess Rodifer, chairman, who is being assisted by Mrs. Don Nollman and Mrs. Irving Astmann.

The club is not affiliated with any other club and belongs to no federation. A meeting in October is planned as well as the senior girls' May banquet, when the scholarship will be awarded, the financial statement read, and officers for the ensuing year elected.

Campus Belles is non-sectarian, non-partisan, and non-profit. Dues are \$5 annually for full membership and \$2.50 for associate membership.

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
