Indians Get Injunction From Arrest

PORTLAND (UPI)—An injunction prohibiting State Police from arresting Indians who fish at Three Mile Dam and adjacent areas on the Umatilla River five miles west of Hermiston was issued Monday in U.S. District Court.

Judge Gus J. Solomon refused to bar the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation from netting salmon, steelhead, eels and other fish.

The Indians asked for the injunction against the state, which has been enforcing state fishing laws prohibiting the Indians from fishing for eels. The injunction applies only to the Three Mile area.

Judge Solomon ruled in 1960 that the Indians had the right to fish at their usual and accustomed stations in the tributaries of the Snake and Columbia Rivers and in the Blue Mountains and adjacent areas. His decision was appealed and upheld Feb. 15 by U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.

Monday's injunction implemented the 1960 decision.

In a separate case the Confederated Tribes have asked \$3 million damages from the government for destruction of their fishing grounds when the dam flooded the area. The case goes back to an 1853 treaty between the federal government and the Cayuse, Walla Walla and Umatilla Indians, who make up the Confederated Tribes.

Auto Firm Eyes State

PORTLAND (UPI)—Republican political candidate Jim Baccellio said today he has learned that a major automobile manufacturer is planning a \$50 million assembly plant on the West Coast, but high property and inventory taxes may keep it out of Oregon.

Baccellio, a Republican candidate for Congress from Oregon's second district, made the announcement at a talk to the North East Kiwanis Club here.

He said he had learned about the plant from a source in Detroit. It is said to be the most modern plant of its type in the nation and would employ 4,000 to 5,000 persons.

He said he has offered to fly to Detroit at his own expense and expound on the advantages of Oregon, including several possible sites in Multnomah County.
