## Price Strike On Salmon Is Settled

Independent commercial salmon fishermen along the Washington and Oregon coasts ended their spontaneous "strike" for higher silver salmon prices Wednesday when most buyers agreed to pay 32 cents per pound.

The packers also raised chinook prices two cents to 37 cents for small, 47 cents for medium and 67 cents for large fish.

Many fishermen at Coos Bay, Newport and Florence returned to the sea Wednesday and the rest planned to go out this morning.

In the Astoria-Megler-Illwaco area, Louis Wright of Bumble Bee Sea Foods at Astoria said he understood most of the fishermen would remain in port until today.

The fishermen agreed to tie up their boats last week when the price for silvers hung at 25 cents a pound without rising when the fish became larger, as it had in past years.

Estimates Varied  
Estimates of the number of boats laying in at the height of the tie-up varied widely, but Leonard Hall, member of the Oregon Fish Commission, set the figure at about 90 per cent of the 3,000 licensed boats along the coast.

Other estimates were as low as 400.

Wright said the break came in fishermen's meetings at Westport, Wash., Monday and Tuesday when Bay Fish Co. of Seattle offered 32 cents per pound.

He said representatives of the fishermen then approached Bumble Bee's outlying stations at Newport, Florence and Illwaco, Wash., with the Bay offer.

Hallmark Met Offer  
Hallmark Fisheries at Charleston also offered 32 cents after fishermen turned down offers of 28 and 30 cents. The 30-cent offer Saturday was accepted tentatively but later rejected. Fishermen at Brookings and in the Eureka, Calif., area accepted the 30-cent offer.

At Newport New England Fish Co., Point Adams Packing Co., and Yaquina Bay Fish Co., met the 32-cent price Wednesday morning.

Fishermen at Florence were getting one cent less at buying stations.

Only the independent fishermen were involved directly in the action, but some members of the Fishermen's Cooperative Association brought their boats in sympathy. Cooperative prices also were expected to climb to 32 cents.

## Immigration Delay Seen

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Congress is likely to put off until next year action on President Kennedy's proposal for a more flexible program to admit immigrants to the United States.

The President proposed Tuesday what would amount to an annual "world quota" plan to replace the 39-year-old "national origins" system that restricts the number of immigrants from any one country to a specific quota.

Kennedy said that the present immigration law was discriminatory and "without basis in either logic or reason." He asked that it be phased out over a five-year period.

The administration's long-awaited proposal was received with little fanfare by a Congress preoccupied with such high-priority problems as the railroad labor dispute, civil rights and tax reduction.

Chairman Emanuel Celler, D-N.Y., of the House Judiciary Committee, introduced the administration bill with a warm endorsement Tuesday.



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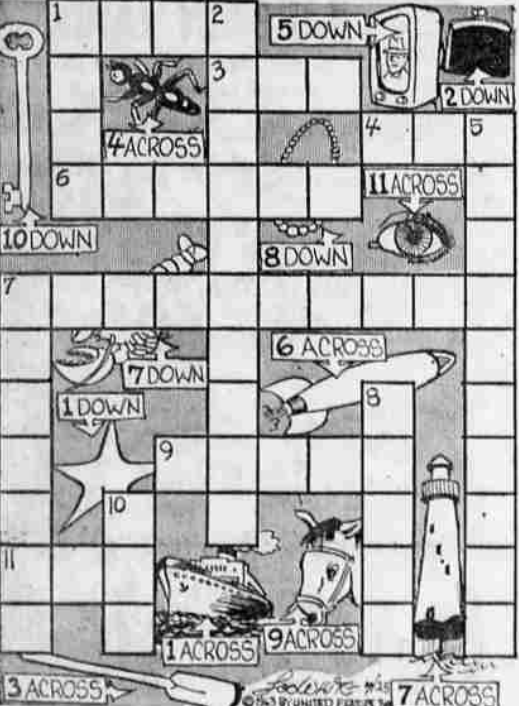
