

Oregon Voters Will Cast Ballots On Three Changes In Constitution

SALEM (UPI)—Oregon voters will cast ballots on three proposed changes in the state's constitution next year.

Set for a vote at the May 15 primary election is a constitutional change authorizing \$30 million in general obligation bonds for the higher education building program.

If voters approve the change, two already-approved laws take effect. One relates to the issuance of general obligation bonds by the State Board of Higher Education, and the other authorizes the board to spend up to \$12 million for buildings.

The other two measures are set for the general election Nov. 3. One would remove mention of the death penalty from the state constitution. The constitution presently sets the penalty for first degree murder at death.

By striking this language from the constitution, the legislature would be allowed by law to set whatever penalty it wished.

The 1963 legislature approved a bill which sets the penalty for first degree murder at life in prison, and extends to 10 years the minimum sentence which must be served before parole can be considered. The new law takes effect if voters approve removal of the death penalty from the constitution.

AF Admits Secret Shot

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Air Force disclosed today that it secretly launched a 176-pound satellite into a wide-swinging orbit almost a month ago to make a broad study of radiation around the earth.

The belated announcement said the research satellite was in a polar orbit, circling the earth every 132.6 minutes and transmitting tape-recorded data twice a day on charged particles in the earth's magnetic field and the upper ionosphere.

At its nearest point, the moonlet passes 200 miles above the earth. At the farthest range, it reaches out to 2,500 miles.

In this extended elliptical orbit, the satellite measures electrons and protons in all energy ranges. It thus provides the broadest gauge study of radiation the Air Force has yet undertaken in a region where it has operational satellites and some day expects to send manned space craft.

The satellite was carried aloft from Vandenberg Air Force Base, Calif., as a sort of hitch-hiker attached to a still secret parent satellite.

They were boosted into orbit by a Thor-Agena rocket June 27. On July 1, the hitch-hiker was separated from the parent space craft at a 200-mile altitude and propelled into its own elliptical orbit by a small solid-fueled motor producing about 2,000 pounds of thrust.

While the parent satellite is a secret vehicle, Air Force officers said there was nothing secret about the research satellite. But no clear explanation was given as to why almost a month went by before announcement was made of the launching.



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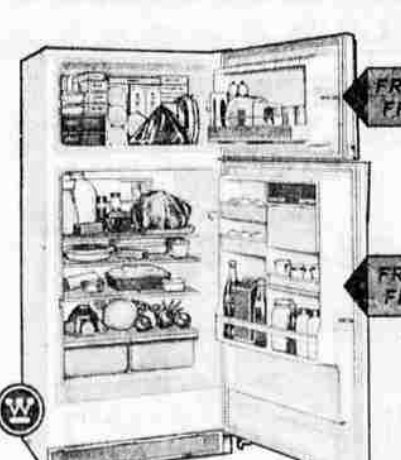

Nixon Calls Communists 'Murderers'

BERLIN (UPI)—Former Vice President Richard M. Nixon crossed into the heart of East Berlin Wednesday and told the Communists they are murderers.

Indignant at controls that kept East Berliners away from him and at Communist newsmen's attacks on the United States, Nixon said "In the West we don't murder people as you do."

"Yes, you do," Nixon shouted at an East Berlin newsmen who denied the charge. "You murder people getting over the wall."

The former vice president engaged in a running debate with East German newsmen as he toured East Berlin with his wife and two daughters, Patricia and Julie, and a State Department official who acted as interpreter.

He called the Communists murderers as he stood on Karl Marx Allee, the former Stalin Allee, East Berlin's main street.

About 30 persons surrounded him at the time and an East Berlin policeman was passing by.

The 30 included about 10 curious East Berliners.

The rest were Eastern and Western newsmen.

Nixon waved to East Berliners, shook hands with a few and exchanged a few words with a few but for the most part Eastern security officials kept East Berliners moving past him.

"There was little chance to talk to anyone," Nixon said.

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
