

Industry Group Plans Fight On Tax Referral

SALEM (UPI)—Associated Oregon Industries announced today it would oppose passage of the tax referendum if it gets on the ballot in October.

The Oregon Supreme Court heard arguments on the ballot title for the tax referendum this afternoon.

Its decision on the title will clear the way for opponents of the 1993 legislature's tax bill, designed to raise an additional \$80 million, to circulate petitions to try to put it before the people for vote.

The ballot title prepared by Atty. Gen. Robert V. Thornton has been challenged by a Lane County group on the grounds it doesn't adequately explain the bill's effects.

In calling for defeat of the tax referendum if it should come to vote, Associated Oregon Industries President Robert Carey said its passage "could open a Pandora's box of problems for employers and private citizens alike."

"Although we recognize the right of every Oregon taxpayer to reject legislative measures by referendum and that they (taxpayers) have become disturbed by delaying tactics by certain groups, we also recognize what could occur should the legislature be reassembled," Carey said.

Weyerhaeuser Previews Plant

COOS BAY (UPI)—Weyerhaeuser Co. today gave community leaders and news media representatives a preview of what it billed as the nation's newest high-speed, automated forest products plant.

Manager Howard Hunt said the plant here will begin production early next month with 150 employees. He said the plant cost more than \$5 million and will produce 100 million square feet of 3/4 inch plywood annually.

Ultimate plans call for 300 employees and a production of more than 200 million square feet, he said.

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Solons Tell JFK Outlook Excellent On Test Ban

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Senate Democratic leaders told President Kennedy today that the outlook is "excellent" for getting "strong bipartisan support" on ratification of the partial nuclear test ban treaty.

Senate Democratic Leader Mike Mansfield, Mont., told newsmen following a weekly White House legislative conference that the U.S. test ban negotiator, Undersecretary of State W. Averell Harriman, made "a tremendous impression" Monday during an appearance at a joint meeting of three Senate committees on the test ban treaty.

As far as the senators could tell so far, Mansfield said, there are "no gimmicks, no side issues" tied to the treaty. Senate ratification by a two-thirds vote is needed before U.S. participation in the three-power agreement can become final.

While Mansfield indicated Harriman's explanation of the treaty was impressive, a good many senators still were withholding a final commitment on whether they would vote for ratification. They wanted to get a better sampling of the opinions of the folks back home.

Briefings given by Harriman and other administration spokes-

men Monday to congressional committees indicated broad support for the pact in the House as well as the Senate, Mansfield said, and he was more optimistic than many other senators that ratification would come fairly fast.

"We informed the President that the chances for strong bipartisan ratification of the treaty are excellent and that we expected the ratification would come as soon as possible," Mansfield told newsmen after the regular Tuesday breakfast meeting of Democratic House and Senate leaders with Kennedy.

Mansfield said Kennedy expressed hope for "penetrating and fruitful" Senate debate on the treaty.

False Card Expert Play

Al Sobel, chief tournament director of the American Contract Bridge League, does not play bridge often, but when he does he makes things happen.

He sat North and decided to raise his partner's two heart opening to three whereupon his partner went into Blackwood orbit and wound up at seven hearts.

His partner won the spade lead and promptly led the ace and king of diamonds in order to ruff a third diamond and try the trump finesse.

East played the nine and queen of diamonds so South ruffed the third diamond with the queen of hearts. When East could not over-ruff, South led a trump to her ace and dropped West's singleton king.

Was anything wrong with her play? Yes there was, according to Al.

He points out that after East dropped the queen of diamonds, South should have played the ace of hearts in order to pick up a singleton king in either hand.

Another expert asked Al, "Suppose East held three diamonds plus the king and one heart and had dropped the queen of diamonds in order to coax South into laying down the ace of trumps?"

Al replied, "Not this East! That play is for experts only and not for many of them."

Instead of doubling West goes to five spades. North and East pass. What do you do now?

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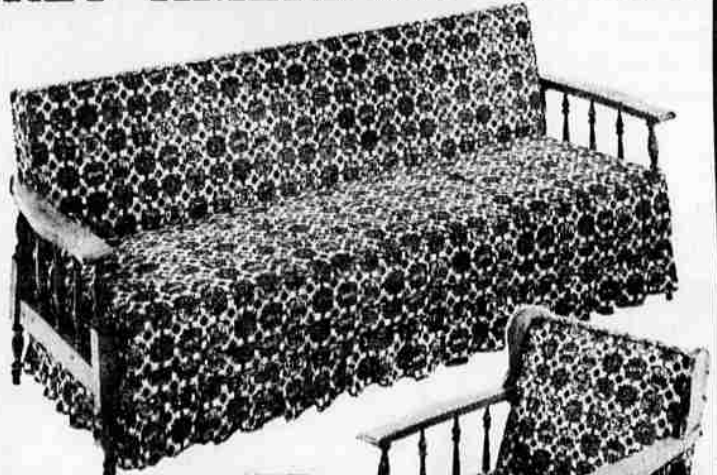
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
