Rusk To Seek More Details On Russia's Proposals For Easing Cold War

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Secretary of State Dean Rusk will seek more information on Russia's proposals for easing tension in Europe when he visits Moscow next week to sign the nuclear test ban treaty, officials said today.

Rusk will not be in a position to negotiate on Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev's suggested East-West non-aggression pact and related measures which Moscow claims will reduce the war peril on both sides of the Iron Curtain. Officials said the United States wants more details on the Soviet proposals to discuss with its Allies before disclosing its reaction. Rusk plans to leave this week-end, probably Saturday, for the Soviet capital. Indications are he will be away from Washington about a week. He hopes to take a small congressional delegation with him to witness the formal signing of the treaty, initiated last week by U. S., British and Soviet representatives.

Game Commission Frees Many Game Farm Birds

Liberations of game farm birds for the coming season was recently completed in the Basin by the Oregon Game Commission. Total releases this summer amounted to 730 pheasants from the Corvallis game farm and 1,083 chukar partridges from the Hermiston farm.

As in the past, releases of young pheasants have been intended to supplement natural stocks for hunting purposes, although straight-run birds are distributed. The distance involved plus the necessary reduction in number of birds per load if held to the hunting season has necessitated early releases.

To overcome this in part and as a replacement for rearing facilities to be abandoned at Hermiston in 1965, a number of rearing enclosures have been constructed at fixed stations about the state including the game management area on Miller Island. With the assistance of Winema chapter members, Izak Walton League, the enclosure was completed recently and an additional 430 pheasants are currently being reared for the hunting season.

Chukar partridge releases amounted to 357 adult breeders last May and 726 young birds in mid-July. It appears now that every suitable habitat area of the county has been liberally planted in an effort to establish wild populations.

It has been confirmed that a number of such established populations are present but as yet they have not responded as successfully as in the more easterly sections of the state. Because of the difficulty associated with hunting these birds, it has not been necessary to curtail local seasons while spreading stocks through recent years.

Typically, farm birds are liberated in areas of heavy hunting pressure or obviously underpopulated areas where hunting by the public is permitted. As usual, the Merrill-Malin area received a liberal salting because of hunting pressure and Langell Valley received a share to boost

ing discussion of cold war problems. The United States has assured its Allies, however, that Rusk will be seeking information and not negotiating behind the back of the Western partners.

One of the principal tasks he faces is to determine whether Khrushchev's proposed European security measures would involve Western concessions on the German problem, including Berlin. Officials acknowledged that the United States has a difficult road ahead in carrying out its promise to Khrushchev to try to get the NATO Allies to enter full-scale discussions on the Soviet proposals.

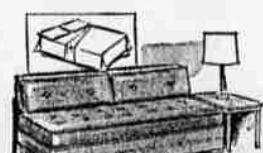

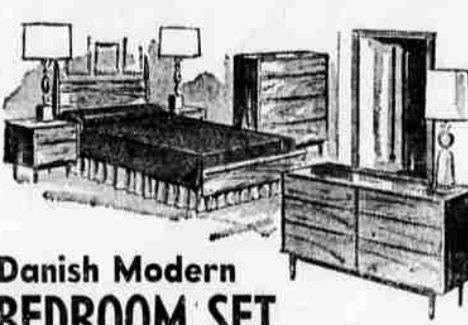

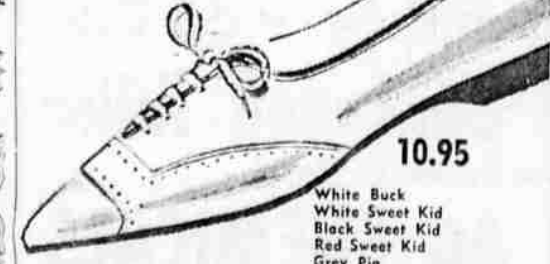
