Williams Hurls No-Hitter In BR Tourney

THE DALLAS — The National League All-Stars from the Basin Babe Ruth League, made itself the favorite of the State Babe Ruth Tournament Thursday night when Bobby Williams unleashed a brilliant no-hit, no-run game against one of the pre-tourney favorites,

Pendleton, and beat them 9-0. The Klamath crew will take on Myrtle Creek tonight in a 9 p.m. game and Coach Bob Moore figures the Nationals should get by this one without too much difficulty. He said Friday morning that he might go with Mike North tonight.

Should the Nationals win tonight, they will be in the finals Sunday afternoon, beginning at 1:30. Williams, throwing his first no-hit game of the season, couldn't have picked a better time to do it. Pendleton was one of the favorites along with

the Madison team of Portland which Pendleton beat. The locals scored four runs in the first inning to give Williams all the cushion he needed and more. He set down 16 of the Pendleton batters by the strikeout route and walked only two in his stint. The third run-

ner that reached base did so on an error. Williams also was the one that put the Klamath team into the scoring column. Rick Brosthorus led off the first for Klamath with a ground out. Mike McNery, second baseman, lashed a single and Bob Moore,

first baseman, singled right behind him. Dave Lyman stroked a fielder's choice and Alan Mezger flied out for the second out.

Williams then came through with his two-run single. Greg Brosthorus then belted the first extra base hit of the game when he got a double to score both Lyman and Williams. Kim Badley ground out to end the inning.

While Williams was mowing the opposition down, the Klamath team coasted through the second with no runs as Russ Smith, Rick Brosthorus and McNery made successive outs.

The Nationals had a good chance for a run in the third when Moore led off with a triple. But he died there. Lyman popped out to the pitcher. Mezger tried to squeeze Moore home on a bunt. He was safe at first on the bunt but Moore was out when interference was called on him as he kicked the loose ball accidentally. Williams stroked his second single but Greg Brosthorus ended the inning with a fly out.



Packers Favored To Cop Shrine Game From Stars

CHICAGO (UPI) — Gridiron know-how made Vince Lombardi's Green Bay Packers a two-to-three touchdown favorite today for the 30th annual game matching the National Football League champions against the College All-Stars.

The All-Stars, coached by Otto Graham for the sixth consecutive year, have their share of 260 and 270 pound behemoths and more backfield speed than usual, but even Graham concedes that the experience of the Packers, NFL titleholders for the last two seasons, will make them hard to beat.

The pro club has won 19 of the 30 games, the All-Stars eight and two games have been tied, while the Packers will be seeking to rack up the fifth straight triumph in the series and their 20th consecutive exhibition victory.

Dick Battistessa of Weed is the leading hitter with 13 hits in 25 bats for a hot .520 mark. Owings is second at .438. Sigado is ninth at .333 and Bianchi 10th at .331. Sigado is tied with Scott Valley's Ed Lapeyre in the runs-batted-in department at 10 each.

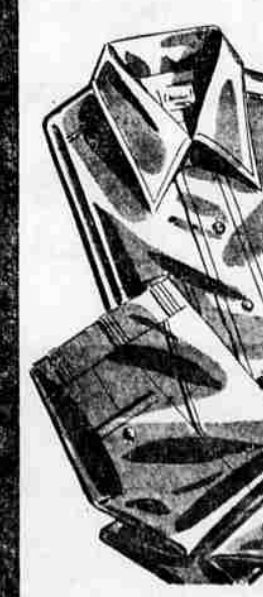
The victory stretched their winning streak in Japan to seven wins against one draw. They have one more match, in Tokyo Saturday, before returning home.
