Hawaii Paper Strike End Due Wednesday

HONOLULU (UPI) — Hawaii's Newspaper Guild, pressmen, mailers, lithographers and the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union.

The new pact calls for a \$12-\$15 wage increase over the next three years, retroactive to June 1. A union spokesman said the new contract grants annual raises of \$4 a week to minimum salaried employees and \$5 to maximum salaried workers.

The contract also calls for four-week vacations for 20-year employees. Union officials said the agreement would be worth \$2,223 more to each permanent employee in wages and fringe benefits during the next three years and cost the newspapers \$1,778,000.

De Gaulle Nixes Test Ban Okay

PARIS (UPI) — French President Charles de Gaulle stood firmly Monday by his refusal to

sign the Moscow nuclear test ban pact.

There was no official reaction here to the signing and none was expected.

But French officials said there has been no change in the French government's attitude since De Gaulle's news conference a week ago.

In it, De Gaulle said he "approved" of the treaty signed Monday by the United States, Great Britain and Russia and shared President Kennedy's "joy" in its conclusion. But he made it clear he does not consider it goes far enough.

De Gaulle told his listeners that if France signed the agreement now it merely would be accepting the "nuclear monopoly" of the other three powers.

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Japan Reds Rap Treaty

HIROSHIMA, Japan (UPI) — Japanese Communists aligned with Red China in opposition to the Moscow test ban agreement have

packed an international anti-nuclear conference with their own delegates, the Japanese Federation of Trade Unions charged today.

The second session of the Ninth World Conference Against Atomic and Hydrogen Bombs opened in Hiroshima today on the 18th anniversary of the World War II obliteration of the city by an atom bomb.

But the trade federation, the largest labor organization in Japan, announced it was pulling out of the current meeting although it intended to remain a member of the Japan council against atomic and hydrogen bombs.
