

Fair Opens Competition To Other Basin Entries

TULELAKE — Klamath County residents who would like to enter competition in the Tulelake Butte Valley Fair at Tulelake, Sept. 8-9-10, will find several classes open this year for exhibitors.

William C. Whitaker, fair secretary-manager, said Wednesday that because of lack of space some divisions are still limited to exhibitors within the 10-A District of California which includes generally the Tulelake and Butte Valley area.

The scope of divisions for Klamath County exhibitors has been widened considerably for 1963. Exhibitors may make application to enter by filing with the fair office not later than 5 p.m. Aug. 30.

More than \$15,000 in premiums is offered for this year's fair.

Departments are opened to the following: light horse, Modoc, Siskiyou and Klamath counties; beef cattle, Modoc, Siskiyou and Klamath; sheep division, Modoc and Siskiyou; horse show, feature exhibits, one-family farm exhibit,

agriculture and horticulture, home economics (food and clothing), home economics (feature display), 10-A District only.

Floriculture, Modoc, Siskiyou and Klamath; arts and crafts, Modoc, Siskiyou and Klamath; junior feature exhibits (booths), FFA entries, Alturas section of FFA Teachers Association and Klamath County; 4-H entries, Modoc, Siskiyou and Klamath counties; showmanship and round robin, same as for junior feature exhibits.

Four-H livestock, beef and swine, Modoc, Siskiyou and Klamath counties; sheep, foods, clothing, forestry, entomology, Modoc and Siskiyou; Future Homemakers of America, Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts and Brownies, 10-A District only; Future Homemakers of America, foods and clothing and feature exhibits (booths); FFA chapters of Modoc and Siskiyou and that area in Shasta and Lassen counties lying east and north of Burney Mountain.

Escalator Crushes Girl; Father Killed In Rescue

CAMDEN, N.J. (UPI)—A Garden State Park employee and his 10-year-old daughter were crushed to death in an escalator Wednesday as he showed the child around the race track in nearby Cherry Hill Township.

The victims, John P. Sweeney, 36, Maple Shade, and his daughter, Margaret, were killed in the mezzanine of the clubhouse section after riding the escalator up from the ground floor.

Camden County Coroner Jules Shasshauser said the girl fell head first into an opening at the top of the moving stairs where a floor plate had been removed by a workman to make adjustments. The workman was away at the time the Sweeneys and a friend boarded the escalator.

The child's body was crushed between the casing and the stairs. Her father went into the opening feet first in an attempt to rescue her.

His body was pulled into the mechanism and he was crushed to death.

Ronald Haines, a neighbor of Sweeney's who was with them, became hysterical after the mishap and fled. Police began a search for him.

Sweeney's wife is a nurse at Cooper Hospital here. The couple had another daughter, Claudia, and a son, Patrick.

Lawyers To Appeal Arrests Of 352 Race Demonstrators

Attorneys for 352 persons charged with violating an anti-demonstration injunction at Danville, Va., said they would ask a federal court today to take jurisdiction over their cases.

The lawyers are to appear before Judge Simon E. Sobeloff of the U.S. 4th Circuit Court of Appeals in Baltimore, Md. If Sobeloff refuses to switch the cases from Virginia courts to federal courts, attorneys said they would request a stay of the trials until Sobeloff rules on the constitutionality of the injunction.

Trial of the demonstrators began Wednesday at Danville. Mobile County, Ala., school board attorney George Wood was expected to ask the Supreme Court in Washington today to stay a federal court order that Mobile schools be desegregated next month.

There were a number of racial demonstrations in North Carolina Wednesday. About 300 Negroes marched in downtown Goldsboro, N.C., Wednesday night and police arrested 33 Negroes in a protest demonstration at a barbecue restaurant operated by a Negro for whites only.

About 300 Negroes gathered at the Winston-Salem city hall Wednesday night, singing "freedom" songs, and a crowd of about 150 whites congregated across the street. But police kept order. A group of 75 persons marched through the University of North Carolina campus at Chapel Hill, N.C. Eleven Negroes were arrested during a demonstration in front of a segregated restaurant at Enfield, N.C., six Negroes were arrested for staging sit-ins at a restaurant and two supermarkets in Dunn, N.C., and about 20 Negroes, protesting

pass charges stemming from racial demonstrations and given sentences from two to six months.

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Crews Laying Storm Drainage

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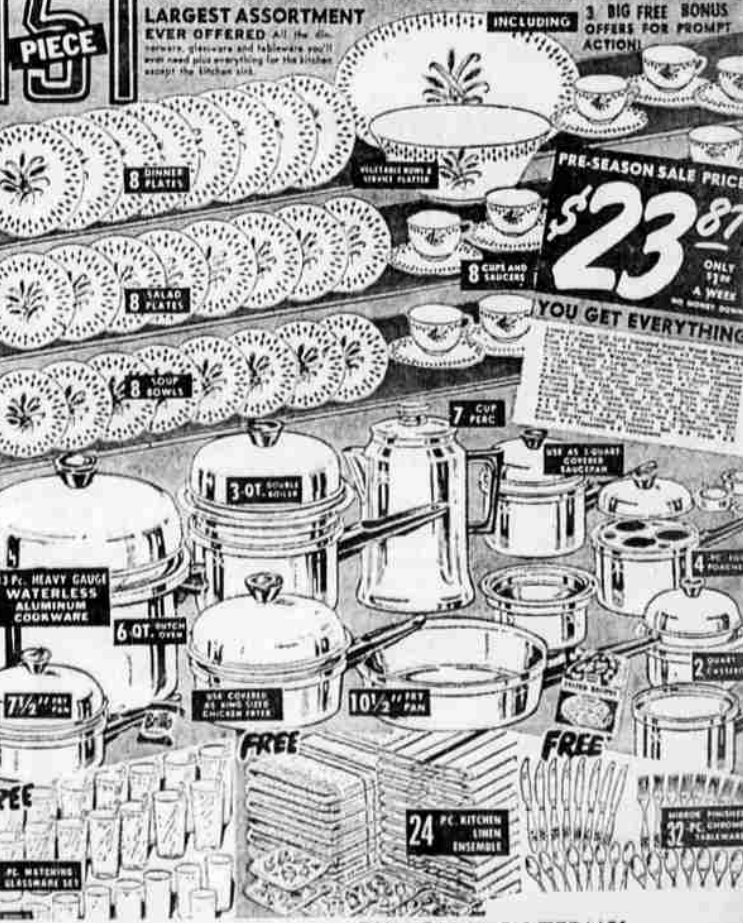


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
