Elimination Play Works

The old recipe for rabbit stew starts with the advice, "First catch a rabbit."
The best advice to bridge players is "First bid your slam, then make it."

In the York, Pa., regional practically every South player reached six spades and almost all of them took the club finesse and went down.

Col. Bill Christian of Staten Island, made the slam in spite of the club finesse being wrong. His strategy was an elimination play that forced West to give him the hand. Of course, the elimination play might not have worked, but Bill kept the finesse in reserve in case the extra chance did not come off.

Bill started proceedings by winning the diamond opening and ruffing a diamond. Then he cashed his ace of hearts and noted that West dropped the ten. Two rounds of trumps left Bill in dummy and exhausted the adverse trumps.

Then Bill discarded one club on dummy's last high diamond, led a heart and played his eight. West had to win with the queen and Bill's eliminator had done its job. West couldn't lead a heart or a trump. If he led a club the play would take Bill's finesse for him, if he led a diamond Bill would ruff in dummy and discard the last low club from his own hand.

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Sportsmen Request Ban On Commercial Fishing

SALEM (UPI)—A sportsmen's group has filed preliminary petitions for an initiative to close all Oregon inland waters to commercial salmon and steelhead fishing. If the measure gets on the November, 1964, general election ballot and is approved by the people it would mean the end of commercial salmon fishing in the Columbia River.

The group must obtain 37,000 signatures on petitions by July 2, 1964, to bring the proposal to vote. The initiative is the latest in a long series of battles between sports and commercial fishermen.

Other Streams Barred
In 1956, voters by a 401,882 to 259,309 margin approved an initiative which prohibited commercial fishing for salmon in all rivers except the Columbia.

Two years ago a sportsmen's attempt to restrict commercial fishermen from taking steelhead in the Columbia failed when the Oregon Supreme Court ruled many of the signatures on initiative petitions were invalid.

Many of the signatures were on petitions which carried a ballot title which the high court invalid-

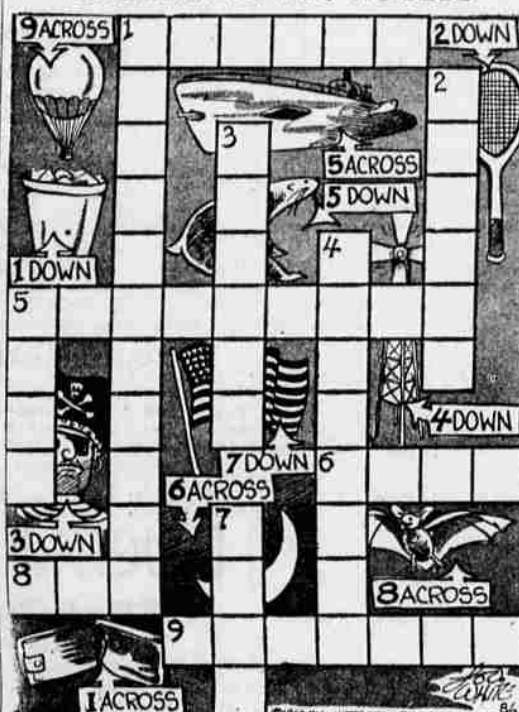
Woman Shifted To Pen
