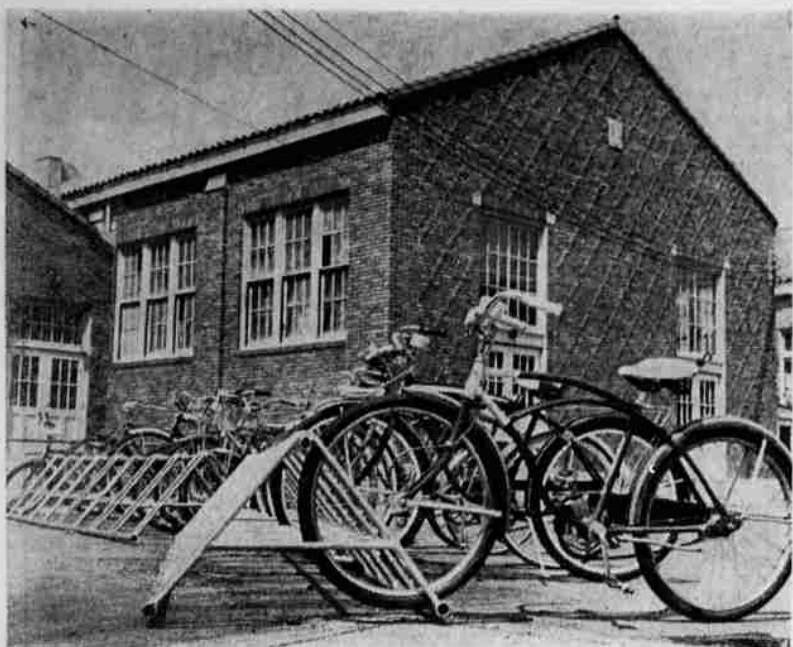
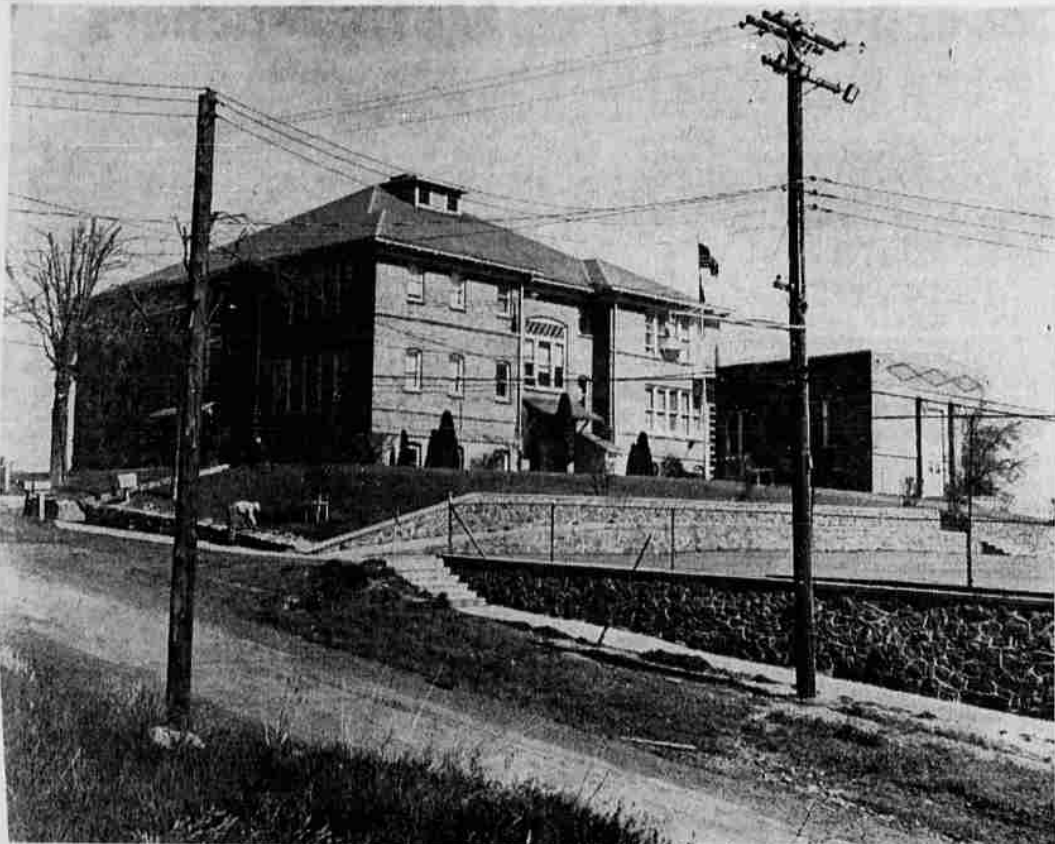




THE RACKS FILL UP — As youngsters head back to school the dormant bike racks fill up once again as they were in this springtime view taken at Roosevelt School.

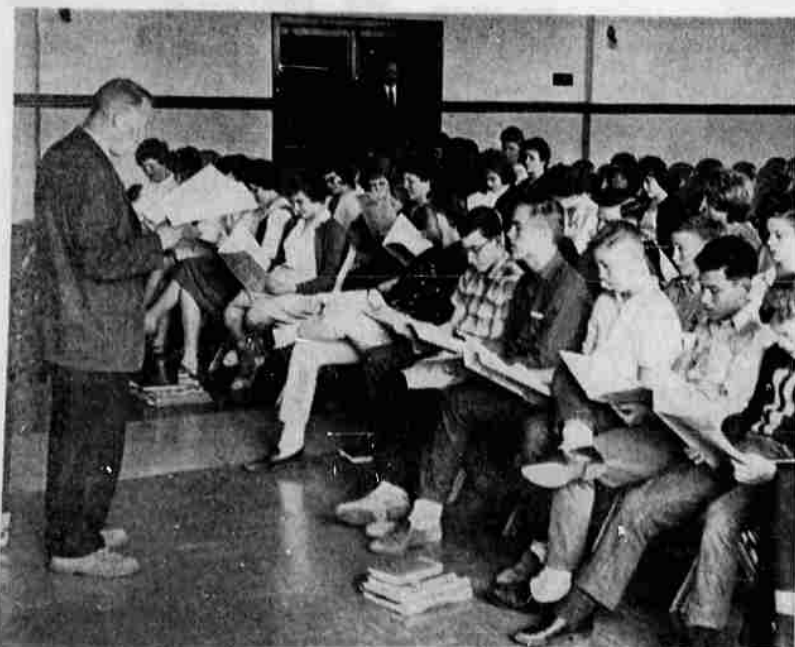
