

Ninth Grade Lakeview Class To Be Largest In History

LAKEVIEW—The ninth grade this fall will be the largest class in the history of the Lakeview High School with 135 students expected to enroll in what is now part of the junior high school. The enrollment in the three junior high grades is expected to be approximately 335 and in the three grades of the senior high, 325, according to word from Rex Hunsaker, high school principal.

The total enrollment in the city schools as of the close of school in June showed 1369 students, broken down in the following divisions: grades one to six inclusive, 689; seventh, eighth and ninth, 321; 10, 11 and 12, 268; and kindergarten, 91. In the county

The dedication of the new high school is also in the offing for the early part of the school year. The board of education for School District No. 7, Lakeview, is made up of John E. Orr is also city school superintendent.

Principals of the various schools in the city are: Rex Hunsaker, senior high school; Paul Revis, junior high school; Melvin Mitchell, Arthur D. Hay School; Mrs. Hazel Murphy, M. W. Bullard School, and Irving Elie, John C. Fremont School. Mrs. Bernice Moffitt is supervisor of the J. T. McDonald Kindergarten.

Twenty one new teachers have been added to the city staffs and a complete list of these and their duties will be released in the near future.

MOUNT SHASTA—At a school board meeting recently the Mount Shasta School Board voted a budget "smaller" than a year ago. This year \$846,688 is set aside for use. A year ago the budget was \$871,946.

63 Per Cent Use Library

LAKEVIEW — Sixty three per cent of the population of Lake County is registered as borrowers of books, periodicals and other material from the Lake County Library, according to the annual report compiled at the close of the fiscal year, June 30.

The total number of borrowers registered at the close of the fiscal year at the library headquarters in Lakeview was 4,152, with 1,563 adults listed and 2,589 juveniles. At the beginning of the year the total was 3,908, with 1,414 adults and 2,494 juveniles. Added to these during the year were new registrations of 443 adults and 368 juveniles, or 811 total. Withdrawn during the same period were 294 adults and 273 juveniles.

The total circulation for the year amounted to 44,085, broken down as follows: Fiction, 12,749 adult, 20,545 juvenile; non-fiction, 5,947 adult, 3,570 juvenile; unbound periodicals, 1,274.

The number of volumes in the book stock at the close of the fiscal year was 16,775, of which 9,324 were adult and 7,451 juvenile. This compares with a total of 16,350 at the beginning of the year. There were 948 volumes added and 523 withdrawn.

The library staff at the end of August will consist of Mrs. Leota Frakes, librarian; Mrs. Margaret Cahill and Mrs. Merle Rice, assistants, plus two high school students. The library board is made up of Mrs. Charlotte Pendleton, president; Mrs. Jo Peely, secretary; Mrs. Dorothy Baughman, Leslie Shaw, and Rev. Lester Boulden.
