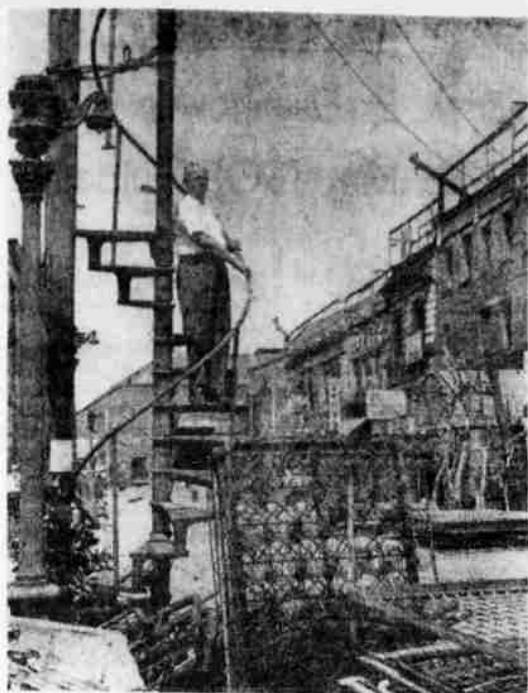

Out of curiosity, therefore, I scanned the story-lines of the shows that the networks had to offer him Thursday night. I only surveyed the programs that ended before 10 o'clock, because that is when he goes to bed. And I thought you might be interested in some of the plots that made up the bulk of the schedule, all of which were repeats:

— "Dr. Kildare." A beautiful and pregnant young woman dreads having her first baby.

— "Perry Mason." The rivalry for an executive promotion in an investment firm leads to blackmail and murder.

— "Twilight Zone." The care-

taker of a "murderer's row" in a museum moves the figures of Jack the Ripper and other violent criminals of the past into his basement — and I guess you know what happened.

— "Fair Exchange." An ex-vaudeville is stunned when his young son, hardly older than his brother-in-law, decides to study law instead of going into show business.

— "Leave It To Beaver." A girl cancels her movie date because she has to stay home with her younger sister, and there is an attempt to overcome this problem.

— "My Three Sons." Rushing to pack for a business trip, Fred MacMurray's saccharine goes out, leaving him helpless. When he tries to get his doctor, he learns that the physician has become an obstetrician and cannot leave an office full of expectant mothers.

Lawrence Welk's Favorite Avocation Is Golf Course

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — The tall, slender man on the first tee at Bel-Air Country Club was heard to mutter, "Ah, one, ah, two," just before starting his backswing.

And on closer examination — sure enough — it was maestro Lawrence Welk at his favorite avocation.

When Welk tires of swinging a baton he grabs a golf club and swings around the course, shoot-

ing in the 80s. Bel-Air is his favorite links, but when the musician-television star is in Palm Springs he can also be found on the Eldorado course.

After 30 years of traveling the length and breadth of the United States playing one-night stands, Welk finally has managed to stay pretty much in one place, Southern California.

During the summer he will accept such dates as the Milwaukee Fair, the Chicago music festival and a three-week stand at Lake Tahoe. But that is the extent of it.

His weekly ABC-TV show and twice-weekly dance fests at the Hollywood Palladium keep him busy enough right at home.

Additionally, millionaire Welk drives in his own office building every morning at 7:30 for a full day's work on his various corporations, which include music publishing firms and a prospering real estate business.

His sparkling new high-rise office building fronts on Wilshire Boulevard and is only a few minutes drive from his Brentwood home.

Welk has been married to his wife, Fern, for 32 years. The Welk children are grown and have left the nest. Daughters Donna Lee, 26, and Shirley Jean, 31, are both married to doctors. Son Larry Jr., 23, works for a record company and spends most of his time traveling.

The seven-room home includes a basement playroom with shuffle-

board court and pool table. There is an office above the garage where Welk manages to put in a few hours work in the evening.

The musician's design for modest living precludes servants. Mrs. Welk does all the house work and cooking. Because her husband has a stomach ailment she must keep the meals simple and plain.

The couple's one luxury is a four — bedroom home in Palm Springs which they frequently loan to friends. It has a swimming pool.

Each Sunday morning Welk can be seen driving the few blocks from his home to St. Martin's Catholic Church in Westwood. Essentially a religious man, Welk's reading is almost limited to philosophy and books on religion.

In addition to his other activities Welk keeps a close eye on the direction and musical components of his show. He works long hours perfecting the various arrangements that eventually are heard and seen on the air.

His clothes are plain and solid colored for television. But when he is on the golf course Welk frequently is flashily dressed in pastel trousers and bright sweaters.

In person Welk is more relaxed and personable than he appears on the air. He has a limited fund of small talk, preferring to listen than gab.
