Republican presidential nominee aspirants should be given a "come and get it" dinner bell going for the Oregon primary, Hatfield said. No serious contender should sidestep a confrontation next May, he added.
Hatfield said the state and county GOP groups have a job to do in showing up the party organization, filling vacant precinct posts, raising funds, studying issues and compiling records of opponents.
In noting reports that have indicated he is trying to get a place on the national party ticket Hatfield declared, "the condemnation of you don't make the effort you are a status quo governor; if you make changes in administrative personnel you are a dictator; if you don't you are dominated by bureaucrats," said.
Hatfield had high praise for State Sen. Anthony Yturri, the minority leader in the last session of the legislature.
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"You have here a man who preme court, Congress and re-should be quadruplets so he could main in the Senate to become its run for attorney general, the su-president," he said.
