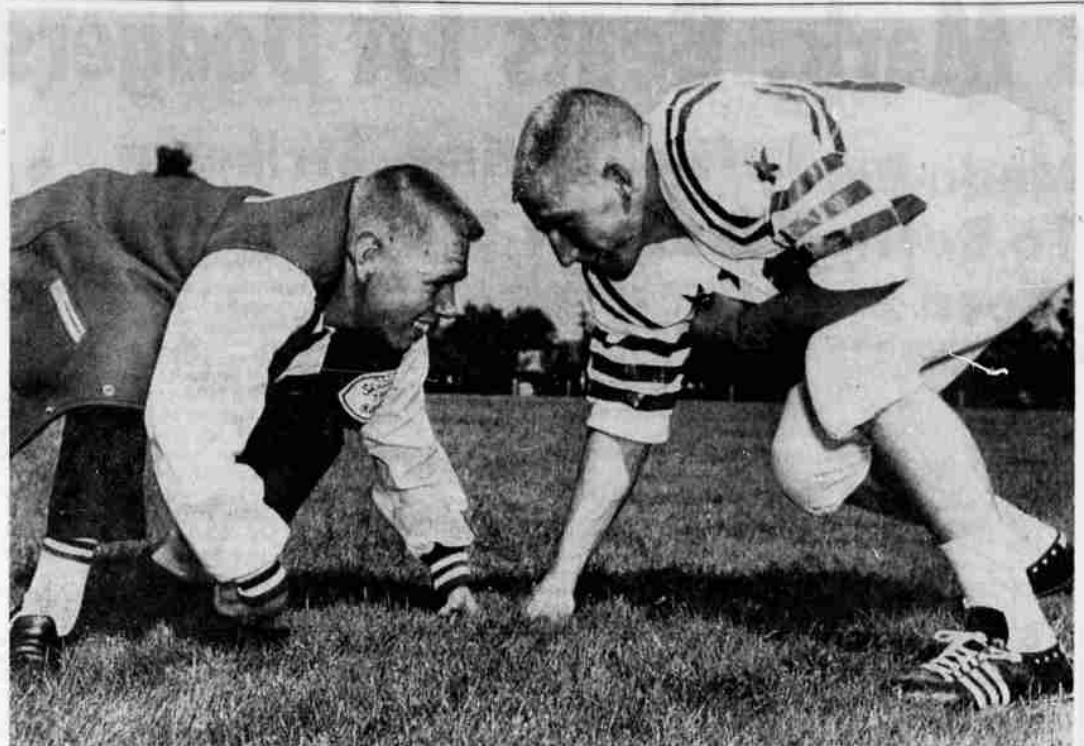

Butts' Attorneys May Use One More Witness In Libel Trial

ATLANTA (UPI) — Attorneys for Wallace Butts planned to read parts of two depositions and perhaps put one more witness on the stand today before resting their case in the \$10 million libel suit against the Saturday Evening Post.

The suit is in its second week before a jury of 12 businessmen in the federal courtroom in the old post office building here.

Butts, whose career as a coach and athletic director at the University of Georgia has spanned nearly a quarter of a century, sued the Post following the publication of a story last March 23 that Butts and Alabama coach Paul (Bear) Bryant conspired to rig the outcome of the 1962 Alabama-Georgia game which Alabama won by the lopsided score of 35-0.

Butts, sometimes tearfully, has denied that he gave away any secrets.

Bryant Also Sues

Bryant also has denied the rigging claim and has a multi-million-dollar suit pending against the Post.

The Post said Atlanta insurance man George Burnett accidentally overheard a telephone conversation between Butts, who has since resigned as Georgia athletic director, and Bryant prior to the game.

Burnett said he took notes of the conversation, a facet of the suit that has drawn considerable testimony from a number of assistant coaches and others during the trial.

A witness Tuesday, Atlanta restaurant operator John Carmichael, challenged the authenticity of the notes.

Carmichael was shown a copy of the notes the Post had introduced as evidence.

He was asked if they were the same notes Burnett made last September, nine days prior to the game.

"No sir, these are not the same notes," Carmichael answered.

Former Employer

Carmichael, testifying as one of the final witnesses for Butts, is a former employer of Burnett. He said the insurance man came to him and told him of overhearing the Butts-Bryant conversation.

Burnett was quoted as saying, "John, I've got myself in an awful trap and I don't know what to do about it." Carmichael said Burnett told him that he had told a friend about the conversation and it had reached University of Georgia officials.

Carmichael testified that he called Butts, in Philadelphia on a business trip at the time, and told him of the development. The two of them had owned stock in the same venture at one time.

He said Butts told him: "I'll tell you this, I'm sure there's nothing to it, because I'd never do anything to hurt the University of Georgia."

Carmichael said he had seen the Burnett notes shortly after they were made and they were not the same as the ones introduced by Post attorney Welborn Cody last week.

Denver Cellar Team Despite League-Leading Batting Eye

Denver is resting comfortably in the cellar of the Pacific Coast League's Southern Division, but the Bears are still the best hitting team in the loop.

Denver is batting .285 as a team, while nobody else is over .270. The Bears are also more than 100 runs ahead of their nearest competitor and also top the league in homers.

In other words, on those rare occasions when Denver gets some pitching, it's pretty hard to beat the Bears.

That was the story Tuesday night at Spokane where a good-sized crowd of 3,000 sat through a lightning storm and watched Dennis Ribant of the Bears toss a three-hitter against the league leaders.

While lightning was flashing around the ballpark, Denver's bats provided the thunder with 20 hits on the way to an 11-1 romp.

J. W. Porter, Chico Salmon and Corky Withrow had three hits apiece for the Bears. Ribant has managed to compile an 11-7 record despite Denver's over-all losing pace.

Elsewhere around the widespread PCL, San Diego wasted a 5-1 decision at Seattle. Tacoma spotted Salt Lake a 6-1 lead then roared back to take an 8-7 decision, and Hawaii edged Portland 6-5, at Honolulu.
