

Paternity Suit Delays Dictator's Extradition

MIAMI (UPI) — A paternity suit by a 26-year-old blonde beauty today delayed the extradition to Venezuela of former dictator Marcos Perez Jimenez, who says he faces certain death in his homeland.

A state court Tuesday night delayed the extradition, ordered Monday by U. S. Secretary of State Dean Rusk, so that Miss Elena Marita Lorenz could appeal her suit seeking \$200 a month support for herself and the 17-month-old daughter she says Perez fathered.

Perez's four-year legal battle to avoid extradition reached a climax Tuesday when a federal judge refused to delay the extradition.

But Circuit Court Judge Robert Anderson threw up a new barrier when he ordered Perez held in the Dade County jail pending an appeal of a paternity suit brought by Miss Lorenz. Anderson dismissed the suit, but stayed his ruling to give her a chance to appeal.

U. S. attorneys moved today to knock down the state court ruling, and hand the 49-year-old bespectacled Perez to a dozen police and government officials who arrived from Caracas Tuesday to escort him home.

Perez was ordered extradited on the basis of a charge by Venezuelan President Romulo Betancourt that he stole \$13.5 million from the national treasury while he served as dictator-president during 1952-58. He fled the country when his dictatorship fell.

Billy Graham Opens New LA Crusade

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Evangelist Billy Graham, returning to the scene of his first success, said Tuesday a spiritual awakening was much needed in Los Angeles because the entertainment industry is centered here.

"Because of the presence of Hollywood, which sets the norm for so many people, a spiritual awakening here would do more good than almost anywhere else," he said.

The evangelist outlined his objectives for a three-day crusade which begins Thursday in the 10,000-seat Memorial Coliseum.

Graham said he hopes to win people to a knowledge of Christ, help religious groups to see the need to work more closely together, show people what is wrong with American family life and bring about a reeducation of church people to Christ.

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New Red China Attacks On Russia Seen

MOSCOW (UPI) — Diplomatic observers today predicted that Red China would use the new U.S. underground nuclear test as a springboard for a flurry of attacks on Russia.

The Peking regime, deeply embroiled in an ideological quarrel with the Kremlin, has denounced the Russians for signing a partial test ban treaty with the United States and Britain. The Chinese claim Soviet agreement to the treaty is another divergence from Marxism-Leninism.

Diplomatic observers said the American low-yield test in Nevada Monday provided the Red Chinese with ammunition in its dispute with Moscow.

The Peking regime charges that the treaty, which bans tests in the atmosphere, in outer space and under water, is a "dirty fraud" that legalized underground testing.

The diplomats assumed the Chinese would point out to other Communist bloc nations and the non-aligned powers that the United States exploded its underground device only a week after the nuclear accord was signed in Moscow.

The Soviets have defended the treaty as a first step toward disarmament and proof of Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's doctrine of peaceful coexistence with the West.

But the Chinese claim the treaty blocks other Communist states from improving their defenses while enabling the U. S. "imperialists" to build up their nuclear arsenal with underground experiments.

Peaceful coexistence is the root of the Moscow-Peking quarrel. Khrushchev believes communism will triumph over Western capitalism through peaceful competition, but the Peking regime advocates armed rebellion and anti-Western militancy to spread communism.

Jacqueline Released From Otis Hospital

OTIS AFB, Mass. (UPI)—Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy left the hospital today, smiling and walking hand in hand with her husband. The President and Mrs. Kennedy strolled from the hospital door to a waiting sedan at 10:48 a.m. They drove to a helicopter pad about a half mile away and then flew to their summer home on Squaw Island in Hyannis Port, 18 miles away.

Mrs. Kennedy had a happy expression on her face and seemed serene despite the excitement that attended her exit from the hospital.

Mrs. Kennedy entered the base hospital last Wednesday after a dramatic helicopter ride from Squaw Island to undergo a Caesarean section birth of a boy who died less than two days later.

Mrs. Kennedy was anxious to get home to her two children.

The President, on departing, also expressed his gratitude for all they have done.

Physicians described the First Lady's condition as "very good."

More Riots Flare In Bloody Congo

LEOPOLDVILLE, The Congo (UPI)—Troops with orders to shoot to kill were reported to have clashed with rioting civilians again today in the former French Congo capital of Brazzaville across the Congo River from Leopoldville.

There were no details available on the latest reported clashes which follow wild rioting Tuesday when Brazzaville's central prison was burned and all prisoners freed. There were unconfirmed stories that five demonstrators were killed and several wounded.

A 24-hour curfew was in force, with soldiers patrolling the streets to enforce it. All telephone communication with the outside world was cut and most news broadcasts were blacked out.

Complice police and troops marched through the city streets and manned positions along the shores of the Congo River. There were reports that the government had asked French troops stationed near Brazzaville to help.

In Paris, informed sources said French troops were ordered out on direct orders from President Charles de Gaulle to help subdue the Brazzaville riots. They said the direct intervention of French army units during Tuesday's violence was instrumental in quelling the disorders, but that new tension gripped the sprawling African quarter of Poto-Poto today. The sources added that De Gaulle issued his orders following an urgent plea from Congo President Fulbert Youlou.

FOOD FOR AGED

LINCOLN, Neb. (UPI) — The elderly often fail to eat properly. To boost flagging appetites as the years pass, Kathryn Cooley, foods and nutritionist specialist at the University of Nebraska, offered these suggestions to boost appetites:

Take a walk when the weather is good. If you must stay indoors, do odd jobs that require light exercise. Try new foods and new seasonings. Include brightly-colored foods for special eye appeal. Take your time for a leisurely meal in an attractive setting.
