I got the idea from the show from a magazine column that answers questions sent in by curious readers.

Some of the questions are rather bizarre, and, as a hobby, I like to see if I can create situations to fit them.

For example, a reader who gave her name as Ellen Gershenson wanted to know "If Elizabeth Taylor has a mink-lined raincoat, or is that just publicity?"

My guess would be that Miss Gershenson is Miss Taylor's press agent.

Using this as a springboard, I drew up the format for "Who

Asked That?" Here's the way the program will operate:

3. "Is Grace Kelly expecting her third child as the rumors have it?"

4. "How good are the chances of Vice President Lyndon Johnson running for the presidency in 1968?"

5. "Who said, 'love is the history of a woman's life but only an episode in a man's'?"

6. "Is Bonita Granville Wrath-er, who is listed as associate producer of the Lassie TV series, the same Bonita Granville who was a child actress in Hollywood?"

Board Approves Building Plans

WEED—The College of the Siskiyous Board of Trustees has given Allyn Martin, Redding architect, authority to proceed on working plans for a gymnasium for the COS campus.

Preliminary plans were approved at a special board meeting Friday night. Bids for the gymnasium will be let early next year.

The new gymnasium is the second building to be undertaken in the six-year COS expansion program. This building program is financed by a 50-cent override tax approved by the college district voters. A student center, administration building and library building was completed last spring.

U.S. Army Captain Loses Life In South Vietnam Military Action

SAIGON, South Viet Nam (UPI) — An American army captain has been killed in a South Vietnamese military operation against Communist guerrillas, it was reported today.

A U.S. Army spokesman said the captain was shot in the head Tuesday while accompanying government troops on an operation near the town of Quang Ngai, north of Saigon. Another U.S. captain was injured.

The officers names were withheld.

The captain was the 102nd American to die in South Viet Nam since 1961 when the United States started helping the government of President Ngo Dinh Diem in his struggle against Communist penetration. He was the 46th American killed in action to date against Communist Viet Cong guerrillas and the 23rd to die on a combat mission this year.

Thirty Americans have died in

what the Defense Department described as "combat associated accidents." Another 26 American lives have been claimed in non-combat associated accidents.

There are about 12,000 Americans stationed in South Viet Nam, ostensibly for training and aiding South Vietnamese forces.

The continuing struggle against the Viet Cong has been overshadowed recently by the government's political-religious crisis stemming from its dispute with the country's Buddhists.

Tension in the dispute was heightened by a third Buddhist priest's suicide Tuesday in protest against the government's religious policies.

U.S. officials expressed concern that the suicide might spur further anti-government demonstrations that could get out of hand and invite Communist exploitation.

Tuesday's suicide victim was Thich Thanh Tue, 17, a priest who drenched his robes with gasoline, set himself afire and burned to death outside a pagoda near Hue, a city 400 miles north of Saigon.

It was the third such self-immolation by Buddhist clergymen since June, when members of the religion began protesting alleged persecution by Diem's government. The president and many of his high officials are Roman Catholic.

A Buddhist association spokesman said the young priest left notes indicating his act was a protest against the government.

Range Seeds Bids Asked

The Bureau of Land Management, Department of the Interior, has issued an invitation for bids to furnish approximately 605,940 pounds of assorted seeds for re-seeding range lands in Oregon and California.

Bids are to be opened at 2 p.m. (PDT) Aug. 30, in the bureau's office, Room 730, 1002 N.E. Holladay Street, Portland, Ore.

Pure, live, ripe seed is required with delivery f.o.b. to BLM warehouses in Lakeview, Vale, Prineville and Burns, Ore., and in Medford, Ukiah, Susanville and Bakerfield, Calif.

Quantities range from 115 to 350,000 pounds consisting of Hardwing grass, Smilo, Brando and Smooth Bromes, Lana vetch, ryegrass, various wheatgrass, Indian ricegrass, yellow sweetclover and Nomad alfalfa. Approximately 554,500 pounds of seed will go to Oregon; the balance of 51,400 pounds to California.

The bureau is purchasing the seed as part of a stepped-up program for rehabilitation of the Oregon-California range.

Specifications and conditions relating to seed purchases on Invitation No. 1303 are available to prospective bidders at the Bureau of Land Management's Portland office, 1002 N.E. Holladay Street (P.O. Box 3861).

Chief Resigns At Chiloquin

CHILOQUIN—The council met in regular meeting at the city hall Monday, Aug. 12, at 8 p.m. with six members present.

Mayor Starkey stated that Max Smith, chief of police for Chiloquin, would be resigning effective Sept. 1 to go into the state police. Advertisements will be run in the paper for a new chief of police.

A public caucus is to be called to nominate candidates for three councilmen for the coming term which will be held Nov. 5, in a regular city election for a two-year term.

Mayor Starkey brought up proposed changes and additions to the street light system which was discussed and agreed upon by all members present.

The meeting was adjourned early.

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
