West Makes Key Defense

I don't know the nameless bridge player who said, "I don't care who makes the nation's slams as long as I can make the nation's part scores."

I have to agree with him. North should really have made a diamond overcall instead of the takeout double in which case South would have raised diamonds. Three diamonds makes easily and so should two spades, but South timed his play rather poorly and fine defense set him.

He won the first trick with dummy's ace of clubs and led a low spade to his king. West won with the ace and played two clubs. South ruffed the second club, led a diamond to dummy's ace, came back to his hand with the king of diamonds, and led a heart. Dummy's nine forced East's ace and East threw dummy in with the queen of trumps. A diamond lead from dummy gave East a chance to get rid of one of his hearts and then came the queen of hearts!

South was in dummy with the king and couldn't get to his own hand. He led a diamond, but East ruffed with the nine spot and West got rid of his last heart so declarer was held to just one heart trick. Adding this to three trumps, two diamonds and a club only gave South a total of seven.

Where did declarer go wrong? He needed two heart tricks and should have attacked hearts before he got involved with the diamond suit.

Labor Total Stationary

SALEM—The total number of persons working in Oregon changed little from mid-June to mid-July. David H. Cameron, commissioner of the Department of Employment, announced. Only 300 fewer workers had jobs in July, for a total of 732,800. The changes within different industries, however, were large.

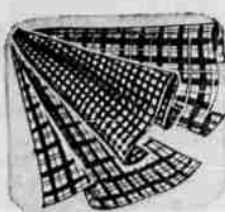
A loss of 7,400 jobs in state and local government resulted from the June closure of educational institutions, and the timing of crops caused an additional 1,400 employee decline in canning and preserving although agricultural workers increased 4,500. Other excellent gains came in contract construction of 1,700 and trade 1,800.

It was the highest level of employment for any July despite the lumber industry labor dispute. An estimated 9,000 workers were involved at mid-July, about the same as in June. The additional plants closed in July came at a time later than the reference point for these estimates. The lumber industry had 7,400 fewer employed than a year earlier.

The big job gain came in non-manufacturing where 22,300 new jobs have opened up since last July. Contract construction up 7,000, trade up 3,800, service up 3,200, and government up 5,500 made the most sizable advances.

Agricultural employment was down almost 11,000 from last July. The big difference was in the strawberry harvest which this July was almost completed by mid-month.

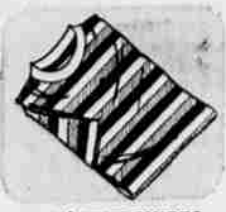
