

Mickey Cohen Suffers Beating From Inmate

ATLANTA, Ga. (UPI)—Rackety Meyer (Mickey) Cohen, 49, was severely beaten with a pipe Wednesday by a fellow inmate at the Atlanta Federal Penitentiary.

Cohen's condition was described by the Justice Department in Washington as "very serious" and Warden E. M. Heritage said a neurologist was examining the California mobster who was serving a 15-year term for tax evasion.

The Justice Department said Cohen was attacked by an inmate with a record as a mental patient who struck Cohen on the head with a length of pipe.

Heritage said Cohen, transferred to the Atlanta prison from Alcatraz earlier this year, was struck "two or three times."

Both Heritage and FBI sources said they did not think the attack had any gangster connections.

The Justice Department said

reports indicated that the attack was the result of an argument Cohen had with the other prisoner.

Heritage said Cohen's blood pressure and pulse were "pretty stable."

The attack occurred in one of the prison shops where Cohen was working as a helper. The assailant ran into the shop and assaulted Cohen with the pipe, the spokesman said.

A spokesman said Cohen's assailant is known to authorities at the prison but his name will not be made public until an investigation by the FBI and the Bureau of Prisons is complete.

The spokesman said the assailant is from a rural community. The two men had no occasion to know each other before they were in prison, the spokesman said.

Macmillan Tells Facts To Justice

LONDON (UPI)—Prime Minister Harold Macmillan Wednesday gave evidence on the Profumo scandal to Lord Denning in the final stage of the judicial probe into the affair.

"Lord Denning called at his own request," said a spokesman at Macmillan's residence. "He stayed a short time and took further evidence from the prime minister."

Denning, the eminent judge who is conducting the investigation on Macmillan's orders, had seen the prime minister previously.

The investigation originally limited to the security aspects of the scandal, was expected to end Wednesday afternoon. A spokesman for Denning said Wednesday's witnesses would be the last of about 160. Denning hopes to present his written report to Macmillan in the early fall.

Informed sources said Macmillan and former War Minister John Profumo have given testimony for Denning's report.

Profumo's resignation because of his love affair with call girl Christine Keeler set off the sensational scandal that nearly toppled Macmillan's government and led to the Denning investigation under pressure from the opposition labor party.

The Profumo affair was linked to the vice case of Dr. Stephen Ward which filled Britain's newspapers with tales of sex among the country's upper crust.

Milk Totals Inspected

SALEM (UPI)—Individual class one milk production figures in Oregon's marketing area one are getting a double check this week as one of the steps in establishing individual producer quotas.

The milk audit and stabilization division of the Oregon Department of Agriculture completed the mailing of letters to 1,413 producers requesting that they check the accuracy of production figures for January through April of 1963. The production figures were those supplied by individual handlers. Area one includes all the state except Malheur, Harney and Curry counties.

"A producer's quota will be determined by comparing his production and class one sales with the area's total production and total class one sales during the same four-month period."

The division chief, Kenneth W. Sawyer, said quotas will be established and in operation by the first of October.

"Prices set by the department under the new milk stabilization act are already in effect."

Migrant Labor Plan Launched

PORTLAND (UPI)—Oregon's migrant labor health project is under way.

Dr. Ralph Sullivan, director of the occupational health section of the State Board of Health, said a public health nurse and sanitarian will work in migrant camps in Yamhill, Washington, Polk, Marion and Malheur counties.

The project is operated under a federal grant of about \$70,000.

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Fishing Measure Given Title For State Ballot

SALEM (UPI)—A ballot of title and statement of purpose were assigned Wednesday to the steelhead and salmon fishing initiative filed recently, Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton announced.

The title he assigned states: "Prohibiting commercial fishing for salmon, steelhead."

He lists the purpose as: "Prohibits commercial fishing for salmon and steelhead in all Oregon inland waters, including boundary rivers. Prohibits all commercial dealings in fish taken illegally."

On Aug. 8 a sportsmen's group filed preliminary petitions for an initiative to close all Oregon inland waters to commercial salmon and steelhead fishing.

If the measure gets on the November, 1964, general election and is approved by the people, it would mean the end of commercial salmon fishing the Columbia River.

The group must obtain 37,000 signatures on petitions by July 2.

The title may be challenged at any time within the next 30 days.

The initiative is another in a long series of battles between sports and commercial fishermen. Sponsor of the new initiative attempt is Save our Salmon and Steelhead, Inc., a new corporation which is headed by Allan L. Kelly, president of the Oregon Inland Water League.

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
