

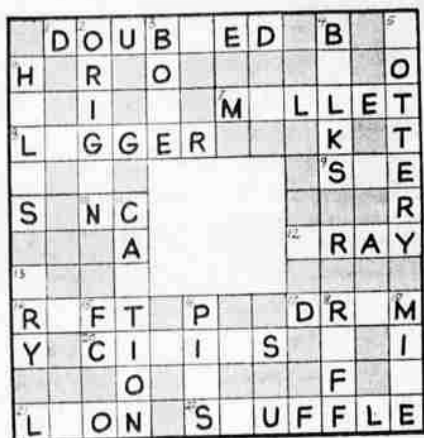

Box 941. Mail entries must be postmarked not later than 5:30 p.m. Tuesday, and entries must be deposited in the COINWORD contest boxes by 12:00 noon Wednesday.

If no correct solution is received, the amount of the weekly prize will be increased \$25.00 each week the puzzle is not solved. (\$2,500.00 maximum).
