

Lake Of The Woods Provides Summer Fun For All Ages

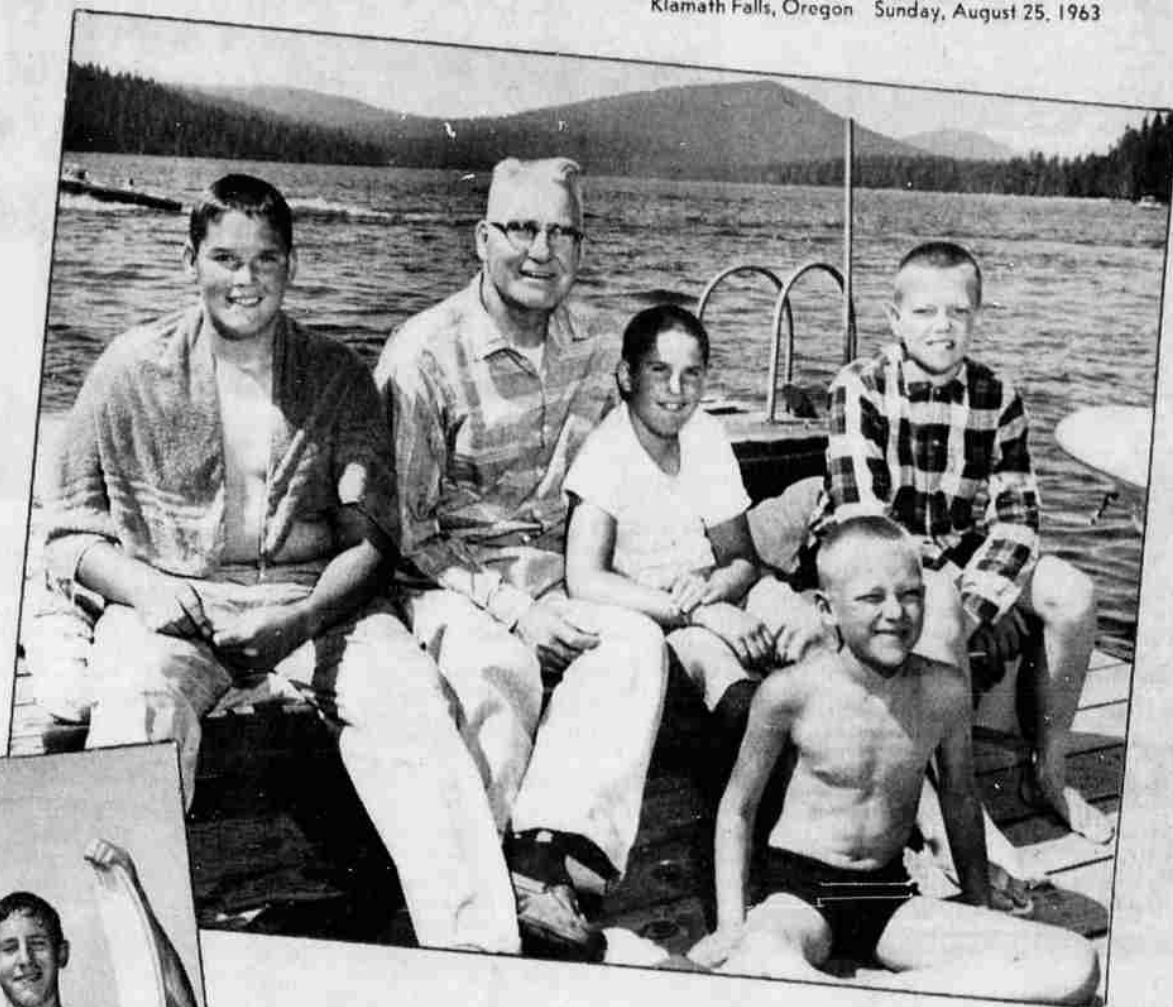
