Ailing Paul Robeson Flies To East Berlin For Rest

BERLIN (UPI) — Ailing Robeson, wife of the famous singer, flew Sunday to East Berlin, shortly after a British newspaper reported he had broken with the Soviet Union.

Robeson, his wife, Eslanda, and an American woman friend identified only as Mrs. Hurwitz made the trip from London by Polish airliner.

They left the airport in a Russian-made automobile for an unknown destination. No trace of the 65-year-old singer has been reported since.

Harold Davidson, Robeson's agent, said in London he had gone to East Germany to convalesce at a spa. The agent said he would be "away four to five weeks" before returning for a recording engagement and a television show.

The London Sunday Telegraph said an attempt might be made to "smuggle" Robeson out of England.

"The attempt may have been prompted by the fact that he may soon be well enough to speak to the press himself," the newspaper said.

The Telegraph quoted Robeson today as saying to one of its correspondents that "the Sunday Telegraph article is vicious misrepresentation."

A Telegraph correspondent who traveled to East Berlin on the same plane as the Robesons wrote that Mrs. Robeson boasted of the "cloak and dagger" way in which she and various Polish officials helped Robeson out of London.

She warned him not to go near the singer but he was finally able to speak to him as "the sat like an elf" just before landing, the correspondent wrote.

Robeson said in a Moscow interview in June, 1947, that Russia was "the country which I love more than any other." He has been living in Britain since his passport was restored by the U.S. government in 1958.

He had been in a London nursing home which specializes in nervous disorders for over a year.

Wife Leaves Young Crosby

HOLLYWOOD (UPI) — The wife of Dennis Crosby, son of crooner Bing Crosby, has hired an attorney to file for divorce.

Dennis is the third of the singer's four adult sons to encounter matrimonial difficulty.

Mrs. Pat Sheehan Crosby, 31, a former showgirl, and the younger Crosby, 29, separated about a week ago, according to friends.

Arthur Groman, an attorney, confirmed Mrs. Crosby intended to end the five-year marriage.

"We still hope to work things out," Mrs. Crosby was quoted as saying, adding that she was "sorry this had to happen. Dennis is a sweet person."

They were married at Las Vegas, Nev., in May of 1958. They have two children, Dennis, 4, and Patrick, 2, plus Mrs. Crosby's 11-year-old son, Franz, by a previous marriage. Crosby adopted the boy.

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Actress Put On Parole

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Actress Marie (The Body) McDonald Saturday began three years' probation for forging two prescriptions to obtain the pain-killing drug percodan.

Superior Judge Donald R. Wright imposed sentence on Miss McDonald Friday. He also fined her \$250. She pleaded guilty to the charge last July 26.

The blonde actress was accompanied to court by San Francisco attorney Jack Ehrlich, who told the judge her physician had given her permission to sign his name to prescriptions when he was not available.

Ehrlich submitted to the court a doctor's report which said the actress was not addicted to percodan or to any other drug. He said she had taken the drug to alleviate pain from ulcers, which caused her hospitalization in Australia earlier this year.

The actress told newsmen she had not taken percodan — an opiate derivative similar to codeine — since she had learned it was irritating rather than helping alleviate her ulcer condition.

Miss McDonald was charged with obtaining percodan on two occasions — at an Encino, Calif., pharmacy last June 27 and a Sherman Oaks, Calif., drug store last July 2.

Beulah Poses As No Threat

MIAMI (UPI) — Hurricane Beulah, the season's second tropical storm, ran a speedy but harmless course southeast of Bermuda today and weathermen said she was no threat to land areas.

The latest advisory located the 103-mile-a-hour winds around Beulah's center at latitude 23.8 north, longitude 60.3 west, or about 325 miles southeast of the British resort.

Gales extended 250 miles from the hurricane's center in the northeast semicircle and about 150 miles to the southwest.

Beulah was moving on a northerly course at nearly 12 miles an hour which would send her "well to the east of Bermuda today," the Miami Weather Bureau said.

Corvallis Fires Chief Of Police

CORVALLIS (UPI) — Police Chief Cecil Fruit has been informed that he will not be retained as chief beyond Sept. 1.

City Manager John Porter told Fruit in a letter that he would not recognize a petition of some 350 persons to keep the chief beyond Sept. 1 when he reaches compulsory retirement age.

Civil Rights Rally Flops In New York

A civil rights rally at New York's Polo Grounds flopped Sunday, but Negroes opened a small crack in one of the Deep South's more formidable racial barriers.

Patients Flee Hospital Fire

LAS VEGAS, Nev. (UPI) — A fire broke out in the operating room of Southern Nevada Memorial Hospital Saturday, forcing the removal of between 40 and 50 patients.

Flames broke through the ceiling of the operating room just as Dr. George Klefgen was completing major surgery on a patient. The patient was rushed from the room to safety.

Smoke, apparently carried through the hospital's air conditioning system, billowed into the four major wards. All patients in the wards, some critically ill, were taken to the shaded lawn of the hospital where the temperature was close to 90 degrees.

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Negroes attended religious services at two white churches at Plaquemine, La., but were turned away at two others. Plaquemine has been the scene of numerous racial arrests.

Only 2,002 persons paid \$2 each to get into the New York baseball park which seats about 30,000. A crowd of about 20,000 had been expected to attend the rally to raise funds and stir up enthusiasm for Wednesday's civil rights march on Washington.

Sponsors, who invested \$40,000 to stage the rally, said it was a "tremendous loss." Most of the principal speakers scheduled to address the rally failed to appear.

About 50 Negroes staged a singing march at High Point, N. C., in a continuing protest against the town segregation policies. Fif-

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teen demonstrators were arrested while picketing a High Point restaurant Saturday night.

Racial developments elsewhere in the nation during the weekend:

Nashville, Tenn. The head of the Roman Catholic Church in Tennessee urged church members to do away with racial discrimination by meeting with Negroes and talking "openly and calmly about our mutual hopes and problems."

Atlanta: The Georgia Federation of Young Republicans condemned the planned Negro mass march on Washington as "unwise and

detrimental to the nation's interest."

Brunswick, Ga. Glynn County School Superintendent R. E. Hood said 17 Negroes have applied for transfer from a local Negro high school to the formerly all-white Glynn Academy here.
