

Rookie Outpitches Reed To Arouse San Diego

Sleeping Giant San Diego may be waking up—thanks to the prodding of a 19-year-old youngster.

Rookie Bill McCool of the Padres outpitched league ace Howie Reed of Spokane in a 2-0 Tuesday night to close the Padres gap in the Southern Division to three games.

The defending champion Padres were everybody's pick to win at least the Southern Division this season. But they were 10½ out not so long ago and have made up seven lengths in 27 games.

As for McCool, he had a 5-13 record at Tampa in the Florida State League, but was still hustled upward by the Padres who liked his 2.01 earned run average and his Roger Craig-like luck of having been on the short end of a shutout on seven occasions.

Last night, McCool blanked the Northern Division kinskins on seven hits, while Mel Queen and Chico Ruiz socked solo homers to provide the night's offensive power. Reed is now 16-7 for the season.

The Padres were able to gain a notch on the Southern Division leading Oklahoma City since Dallas-Fort Worth climbed on 88er ace Jerry Nelson (13-6), who missed in his try for an 11th straight win.

Last anybody think the Southern Division is a two-team race, Dallas-Fort Worth is a half-game ahead of the Padres and 2½ behind Oklahoma City.

In other action Tuesday night, it was Denver 6 Portland 3, Tacoma 7 Seattle 3 and in a doubleheader, Hawaii 3 Salt Lake City 5, and Salt Lake City 1 Hawaii 0 in the 7-inning nightcap.

Dallas-Fort Worth bashed 13 hits off the 88ers with Tony Olivo and Jay Ward providing victory with seventh inning homers.

Oklahoma City opened the ninth with an Al Heist homer, and George Williams—loop leader in triples—banged No. 12. But reliever Gary Dotter got out Bob Boyd and Carroll Hardy to leave the tying run stranded.

Denver's Russ Heman was the difference at Portland where he pitched no-hit ball for five innings before Hector Martinez greeted him with a solo homer.

The Bears meanwhile exploded for four runs in the fifth with Bob Uecker, Steve Demeter, and Tommy Aaron driving in the tal-

lies. Corky Withrow homered for Denver in the eighth as Portland workhorse Jose Santiago rebounded for the defeat.

Another wheelhorse, Gerry Thomas, finally got his 14th win at Tacoma after failing in three prior tries.

Thomas needed help from John Pregoner in the ninth, however. But Big John delighted his nationwide fan club by quickly snuffing out a Seattle threat by getting Dave Hall to hit into a game-ending double play.

Joey Amalfitano chipped in with key singles in two three-run Tacoma outbursts.

Pitching was the king at Salt Lake.

Eli Grba hurled a three-hitter for Hawaii in the opener and Bee southpaw Dick Lemay reciprocated with a four-hitter in the nightcap. Tough luck losers were Phil Mudrock, who tossed a six-hitter, and Hawaii's Ed Thomas.

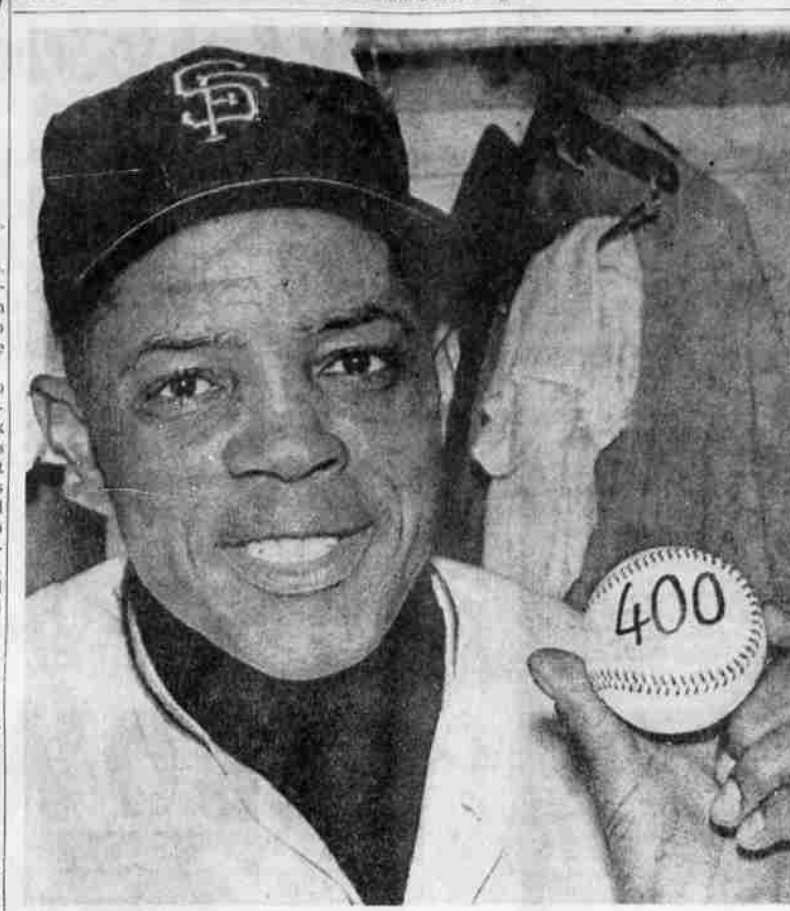

SAN MATEO, Calif. (UPI) — Sammy Ellis of San Diego and Howie Reed of Spokane dominate Pacific Coast League pitching statistics in games through Sunday, according to official statistics released here today.

Statistician William J. Weiss reports that Ellis leads pitchers with 143 innings or more pitched with an earned run mark of 2.08. He also leads the loop in walks with 93.

Reed has compiled a fine 16-1 mark, but his lead among starting hurlers is in jeopardy. Reed lost Tuesday night, while Terry Nelson of Oklahoma City (13-5) and Ray Rippelmeyer of San Diego (11-2) are also vying for honors of having the league's best record.

Chiefs Downright Cocky About Chances In AFL

EDITORS NOTE: This is another in a series of dispatches sizing up the prospects of pro football teams for the 1963 season.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (UPI) —If the Kansas City Chiefs (nee Dallas Texans) were any more optimistic, they'd be downright cocky.

"We're better than we ever were," boasts Hank Stram, head coach of the defending champions of the American Football League.

All the stars and workhorses of the 1962 club which won the crown in a sudden-death, six-quarter marathon against the Houston Oilers are back this season. Stram has an excellent crop of rookies to go with his established players.

And if pre-season games can be used as a gauge, the Chiefs' optimism is justified. The Kansas City team has a 3-1 record in the play-for-fun contests. More important, Stram got a good look at his rookies, and liked what he saw.

The Chiefs close out their exhibition season Saturday against the Houston Oilers in a game at Wichita, Kan. A victory over their arch-rivals, exhibition or not, will leave the Chiefs in a fine frame of mind for their regular season opener Sept. 7 at Denver against the Broncos.

Show Top Form
Quarterback Len Dawson, who led the league in passing in 1962, has displayed the same cool efficiency which carried the Texans to the championship.

Halfback Abner Haynes, the AFL's leading scorer in 1962, and

fullback Curtis McCClinton, last year's rookie-of-the-year, have been no less impressive in exhibition games.

Defensive stars of 1962 are still shining for the Chiefs. The fearsome linebacking trio of E.J. Holub, Sherrill Hendrick and Smokey Stover continue to intercept passes, red-dog quarterbacks and generally diagnose plays with uncanny skill.

Offensive end Chris Burlord, quarterback Dawson's favorite target in 1962; has been bothered this summer with injuries. But in his brief, exhibition-game appearances, Burlord has shown the fitness with which he caught 12 touchdown passes last season, high for the league.

Rookie Crop Fine
To go with this array of talent, coach Stram has some choice rookies, including defensive end Bobby Bell of Minnesota, UPI's college lineman of the year; defensive tackle Junious Buchanan, 27, of Grambling (La.) College.

STARTS TWIN DOUBLE
FREEHOLD, N.J. (UPI)—Twin double wagering, the latest betting innovation, will be introduced at the Freehold Raceway harness track next Tuesday, according to track officials.

Other rookies coach Stram believes will give the team "great assistance" are flanker back Stone Johnson of Grambling, former Olympic dashman, and halfback Jerrel Wilson of the University of Southern Mississippi, a top punter averaging about 40 yards per kick.

Barring injuries to key players, it's hard to envision the Chiefs being knocked out of the top spot in the Eastern Division.
