

Methodists Vote To Cut Segregated Schools' Funds

CHICAGO (UPI) — Delegates to the second Methodist conference resolved Friday that funds to racially segregated Methodist schools should be cut off.

The action brought an immediate response from a Southern del-

egate who warned that the action would adversely affect the church's financial status.

The delegate, the Rev. James R. Scott, Monticello, Ark., said "a large percentage of funds are raised in the so-called 'Bible Belt' and the resolution would cut off the flow of money to the church."

But officials said although there are 135 Methodist related schools and colleges in the United States "less than 20" refuse admission to Negroes.

The Rev. Ernest Dixon Jr., Nashville, Tenn., a Negro, called the conference a success but thought "other members of minority groups — the Indians and Japanese — should be included. I hope we can include these problems in future deliberations."

Bishop T. Otto Nail, Minneapolis, Minn., said "The church has a bad conscience on this matter

of handling the race issue" and remarked that the tone of the speeches was very self-critical.

He said the resolution to withhold funds from segregated schools supported by the church had a "good chance" for passage at the general conference next year but "not without considerable argument and give and take."

Khrushchev Ends Visit

BELGRADE (UPI) — Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev today concluded a 15-day visit which apparently ended the Kremlin's feud with President Tito and brought Yugoslavia closer to the Soviet camp.

Khrushchev's special plane took off for Moscow after a lavish airport sendoff in which Tito said "there are a lot of possibilities for our cooperation."

The two Communist leaders kissed each other on the cheek as a parting gesture for the birth of Soviet - Yugoslav friendship worked out during Khrushchev's "private" visit. The Soviet premier was given a 21-gun salute and an honor guard as he boarded the plane.

The diplomatic corps was on hand, with the exception of representatives of Communist China and Albania, the two principal nations which have defied Moscow's leadership of world communism.

Slight Majority Approve

The resolution said "We urgently recommend that we make it perfectly clear on all levels of the church's life that in our schools and colleges there shall be no racial line for teachers and students and that the name of the church, and funds from its budgets, shall be withdrawn from institutions pursuing a policy contrary to this principle."

A slight majority of the 1,500 delegates approved the resolution by a hand vote.

The resolution was offered by Robert N. Peters, Portland, Ore., who said it would mainly affect the Southeastern and South Central jurisdictions.

"If we're willing to risk the loss of funds from two of our most powerful conferences," he said, "we're implementing our pronouncements, which are otherwise meaningless."

The conference declared: "The Methodist Church is called to change now — to remove the symbol and fact of racial segregation."

Approve Action Demonstrations

It approved direct action demonstrations but said, "The desirable goal is for communities to take corrective action voluntarily."

Resolutions approved by the five day conference that closed Friday are advisory to the general conference of the church scheduled in 1964.

Rescuers Seek Quake Victims

NEW DELHI, India (UPI) — Rescue workers with picks and shovels today dug through the ruin of 38 villages in Kashmir devastated by an earthquake which killed an estimated 100 persons and injured about 500.

The earthquake Monday morning was the worst to hit Kashmir in modern times. The area records up to 20 tremors yearly but rarely has a fatality.

Government officials distributed cloth to bereaved families to make into burial shrouds. Army tents, food and kerosene were also carried in for thousands left homeless in the 56-square-mile disaster area.
