Vikings' Defense Sparkling

The Minnesota Vikings ran up 35 points Friday night but coach Norm Van Brocklin was bragging about his defense.

The long-suffering Viking defenders shut out the St. Louis Cardinals and yielded only 43 yards rushing and 125 passing to post their fourth exhibition victory against a single loss. Quarterback Frank Tarkenton's passing set up two touchdown runs by Bill Brown and one by Tom Wilson, and hit Roy Winston for another tally.

The second pre-season doubleheader Saturday night will pit the unbeaten Baltimore Colts against the Chicago Bears (2-2) at New Orleans after the Dallas Cowboys and Detroit Lions, each with 2-2 marks, clash in the opener. The expected crowd of 50,000, added to the 30,842 who witnessed the St. Louis-Minnesota contest at St. Louis, should push the NFL's exhibition attendance over the one-million mark.

The New York Giants (1-3), minus most of their starting backfield, play Philadelphia, winner of its last two starts after two losses, at Princeton, N. J. Winless Washington tackles the champion Green Bay Packers, winners of four straight, at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and San Francisco, also winless, visits the Rams (1-3) at Los Angeles on Saturday night games.

One Sunday contest has Cleveland playing Pittsburgh, both with identical 2-2 records, at Canton, Ohio, in the televised Hall of Fame Game.

Former Bonus Baby Signed

SEATTLE (UPI)—A former St. Louis Cardinal bonus boy who served jail time in 1960 on a bad check conviction, was signed to a baseball contract by the Seattle Rainiers of the Pacific Coast League Thursday.

"I made a mistake and I paid for it, but that trouble is behind me. Lots of people have tried to help me and I don't want to let them down," Joe Lains said after the signing.

Dick Bee, Rainier general manager, said the left-handed Lains will pitch for the Rainiers Sunday against Spokane.

Lains was signed to a \$10,000 bonus by the Cardinals in 1957 and played for Redbird farm clubs at Omaha in the now defunct American Association, and Stockton of the California League.

With due respect to the sizzling fast balls of Sandy Koufax, the one that really ended the National League pennant race may have been thrown by Don Cardwell of the Pittsburgh Pirates.

It was a whistling pitch Friday night that struck Dick Groat, shortstop and sparkplug of the St. Louis Cardinals, on the chest.

The pitch forced Groat's removal from the first game of the two-night doubleheader, won by the Cardinals, 5-1. But the Pirates, took the second game, 5-0, and enabled the Los Angeles Dodgers to stretch their first-place lead to 5 1/2 games via their 5-2 triumph over the San Francisco Giants.

Without Groat, battling to win his second NL batting title and the acknowledged leader of the Cardinals' late-season drive, the Dodgers' flag worries would appear to be over. Indications are that Groat will miss at least a few games and, in any event, may play several below par during a period when the Cardinals need him most.

Groat was taken to Pittsburgh's Presbyterian University Hospital for X-rays. Pirate team physician Dr. Joseph Finegold said Groat did not suffer any broken ribs but sustained a contusion of the chest wall on the lower left side.

Finegold said Groat may be lost to the Cardinals for several days. The Milwaukee Braves downed the Philadelphia Phillies, 5-0, the New York Mets nipped the Cincinnati Reds, 5-4, and the Chicago Cubs shut out the Houston Colts, 3-0, in other NL action.
