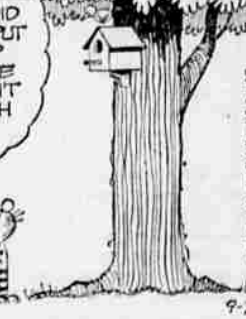


Who is the World's Best-loved Dentist?

B. C. Lumber Shipments Above States

PORTLAND (UPI) — British Columbia lumbermen shipped nearly twice as much lumber to markets than did the western U.S. during July.

The Pacific Lumber Inspection Bureau said Wednesday B.C. lumber companies shipped 173.7 million board feet, compared with 98 million board feet from Oregon, Washington and California.

Approximately one-half of the Canadian shipments went to the United States' Atlantic Coast. The Pacific Northwest lumber strike cut heavily into American shipments the bureau said.

During the first seven months of 1963, British Columbia mills shipped 648 million board feet to the Atlantic Coast. The three western states shipped 277 million board feet. Shipments to Puerto Rico totaled 6.1 million from the U.S. and 42 million from British Columbia.

Seed Check Results Told

Field inspections of crops entered under the seed certification program in Klamath County have been completed for this year. Total potato acreage entered was 1,829 acres which is 105 acres less than a year ago. Fifty-four acres did not meet standards and were turned down during the two field inspections.

Other crops certified totaled 1,681 acres. This included 1,250 acres Bentgrass for seed, 159 acres of other varieties of grass seed and 272 acres of grain. Thirty acres of grain were rejected.

Besides field inspections, seed crops must also pass certain greenhouse and laboratory tests before being eligible for certification tags. With the several inspections and tests, the buyer of certified seed is assured of excellent product which he can depend on to give him good performance.

Agency Seeks Radio Engineer

SALEM (UPI) — Oregon's civil defense agency today is looking for a radio engineer.

The CD radio technician resigned last Friday. The agency has "borrowed" the services of a State Forestry Department radio man for an hour a day to keep up with maintenance of the civil defense communications equipment.

Recruitment is being handled by the state civil service agency, and agency director Melvin Cleveland said "recruitment will continue until the position is filled."

The 1963 legislature slashed the state CD agency from an 18-member staff to a three-member staff.
