## 'Tax Revolt' Results In Denial Of Funds

SALEM (UPI) — The Emergency Board Friday warned of a tax revolt, slashed \$25,000 from the funds set aside for the special Oct. 15 tax referendum election, and refused all money requests submitted by state agencies.

The \$300,000 set aside to finance the referendum election was cut back to \$275,000 after Elections Supervisor Jack Thompson said he thought no more than that would be needed.

The board refused a \$21,650 request from Atty. Gen. Robert Y. Thornton to implement the Uniform Supervision of Trustees for Charitable Purposes Act.

The vote against the appropriation was 6-3.

The board then voted unanimously to deny \$80,556 asked by the State Tax Commission to im-

# Legislative Leaders Split Over Next Step If Tax Hike Defeated

SALEM (UPI) — Legislative leaders appeared split Saturday over whether budget cuts or new taxes should be enacted if voters defeat the \$60 million tax election, and a special legislative session is called.

Senate President Ben Musa, D-The Dalles, told United Press International a defeat of the tax bill "would be a mandate from the people, we couldn't kick the people in the teeth with new taxes."

House Speaker Clarence Barton, D-Coquille, told UPI a special session "should combine some budget cuts with some new taxes, if the tax bill is killed will it mean people oppose any tax increases? A \$60 million cut would be tough to do."

Musa said "I'm getting letters from people who say the state has to live within its budget, just like the people do at home."

He showed a letter from a constituent which suggested abolishing all income taxes and replacing them with a state sales tax.

Barton said he has received mail suggesting a cigarette tax be adopted.

When asked if their different views indicated a fight would develop between the House and Senate at a special session, Barton said "there will be no Senate House fight."

Musa commented "We'd have to work it out."

Asked if they believed Gov. Mark Hatfield should call a special session if the tax bill is defeated, or attempt to make the cuts himself, both Barton and Musa said that decision would be up to the governor.

Barton added "If the governor calls a special session it means he couldn't find a way to cut back that much."

Both Barton and Musa said the public doesn't realize the state began the 1963-68 biennium without a carryover surplus.

They pointed out there was more than \$30 million in surplus available to the 1961 Legislature.

Barton said "We've dipped into the surplus for years, but this year there was no surplus. The legislature didn't increase spend-

## CHAMBER COMMENTS

On Saturday, Oct. 5, some 100 members of the Okanogan-Cariboo Trail (Highway 97) Association are expected in Klamath Falls for an O.C.T.A. rally before driving on to Reno the following day to attend the 31st annual convention of the association.

One of the oldest and most active highway associations in the United States, O.C.T.A. has, for many years, been pressing for designation of one continuous highway from Alaska to Mexico — and possibly, eventually, to the southern tip of South America — as International 97, and as the Pan-American Highway.

"Designation South," the theme of the Reno convention, would indicate that some further action or report on this project is expected at that time.

Not only would single numbering for an international highway several thousand miles in length bring increased tourist traffic and prestige to every community located on it, but this particular highway proposal makes a great deal of sense. Trace it on a map of the western hemisphere and the result is an almost straight line from Fairbanks, Alaska, to Mexico City.

When convention delegates from other Highway 97 communities in Oregon, Washington, British Columbia, Yukon Territory and Alaska stop off for a rally in Klamath Falls Oct. 5, the chamber's Tourist & Convention and Roads & Highways committees plan to have a large number of local 97-philes on hand to welcome them and demonstrate to them that interest in "Designation South" runs high in this area.

Speaking of Highway 97, word received from Governor Hatfield's office last week indicates that steps will be taken immediately to change the sign at the intersection of U.S. 97 and 99 in Weed to indicate "Portland Via Klamath Falls, U.S. 97," to replace the present "Klamath Falls" designation. The governor's letter indicated that he had been informed that California Highway Engineer orders to change the sign, issued early in April, had not been carried out.
