## Search Pressed For Tots

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (UPI)—A grim, unemployed stepfather, a gun strapped to his side, joined in another house-to-house search of a tenement district today for two little playmates missing and feared kidnaped.

As Melvin Leverett, authorities and volunteers pressed their search, there were few new clues into the five-day disappearance of his stepdaughter, Melissa Ann Lee, 5, and her friend, Barbara Ann Foshaug, 4.

## Churchills Observe Anniversary

LONDON (UPI) — Sir Winston and Lady Clementine Churchill today quietly celebrated the 55th anniversary of the wedding that gossips more than a half century ago predicted would not last six months.

Friends said the famous couple had no special plans and would spend the whole day at Chartwell, their country home 22 miles south of London.

The former wartime prime minister, who will be 89 on Nov. 30, appears to have made as full a recovery as could be expected from the broken thigh accident on the Riviera in June, 1962. His health is "quite good for his age," a friend said.

But Lady Clementine's health was reported to have caused the family a bit of worry recently. She was 78 on April 1.

A good part of the day was spent reading the mounds of congratulatory cards, notes and telegrams that poured in on the Churchills from all over the world.

The serenity of the occasion was in sharp contrast to that day in 1906 when an Edwardian dandy named Winston Churchill married a poor relation of the earl of Airliie by the name of Clementine Hozier.

Thousands filled the streets outside St. Margaret's Church in London to get a glimpse of the couple. The event was comparable to a royal wedding and excitement ran high.

Police discounted scribbled notes received Wednesday — one demanding ransom — as "obviously the work of a crank." They said the notes gave no leads as to the whereabouts or fate of the girls.

Mrs. Leverett, 23, mother of Melissa Ann, said the note she received — scrawled in large handwriting with a pen — demanded \$2,000. Capt. Henry Deason, head of the police homicide division, said the figure specified on the note in childish writing was \$2 million.

"It's hogwash," Deason said. "Obviously the work of a crank." The girls were last seen Saturday evening. Another 5-year-old playmate said a tall, black-haired man who enticed the tots with candy forced Melissa into his car and Barbara followed voluntarily.

Leverett and his wife have searched in their pickup truck from dawn into the dark each day since.

## Goldwater Urges Party Unity

CHICAGO (UPI) — Sen. Barry M. Goldwater, R-Ariz., urged fellow Republicans Wednesday night to direct their anger toward the New Frontier—"rather than chew on members of your own party."

Goldwater, speaking to a friendly audience that included Illinois' top Republicans, pleaded for unity against President Kennedy and what the senator called "a 'daddy knows best' attitude toward the American people."

The speech, delivered before the National Federation of Republican Women, marked a key appearance by Goldwater during his current cross-country swing.

Gubernatorial candidates Charles H. Percy, who was chairman of the 1960 Republican platform committee, and Hayes Robertson, Cook County GOP chairman, were in attendance.

They were not present last weekend when New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller and his wife, Happy, went to a fair at Oregon, Ill.

In his speech, Goldwater did not mention Rockefeller by name or refer explicitly to the Rockefeller attack recently on the "radical right" of the Republican party.

"I would remind you that there are many New Frontiersmen to direct your anger toward—rather than chewing on members of your own party," Goldwater said.

Goldwater, who along with Rockefeller is expected to be a top contender for the presidential nomination next year, refused to be labeled.

"I am a Republican, pure and simple," Goldwater said. "I hope not too simple."

## Resolution Asks End To Viet Aid

WASHINGTON (UPI)—The first indication of congressional anger at the Ngo Dinh Diem government's action against the Buddhists came today when a resolution was offered in the Senate urging that all U.S. aid to South Viet Nam be cut off.

Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, who sponsored the resolution, said Americans were "dismayed" at the Diem government's "cruel repression" of the Buddhists. "Such grisly scenes have not been witnessed since the Christian martyrs marched hand-in-hand to the Roman arenas," he said.

Church rejected arguments that U.S. aid was needed to stem the Communist tide in South Viet Nam. He said that if the Diem government did not change its policy the country would fall to the Reds anyway.
