Post Office Pushes Modernization As Mail Volume Continues To Climb

The United States Post Office Department will deliver more than 60 billion pieces of mail this year — an average of 370 pieces for each man, woman and child in the nation.

These and other statistics are included in the report of the Post Office Department for fiscal 1963.

The report says the 60 billion pieces equal more than half of the annual mail total of the entire world and is increasing at the rate of some 2.5 million pieces per year. This, the report says, is "equivalent to adding the entire mail of a country as large as Belgium to ours."

The department estimates that the mail volume will reach 90 billion pieces by 1970.

In 1962, the report says, the department operated with a 15 per cent deficit in its operating costs. It is estimated that this deficit will drop to nine per cent for this year and down to 3.75 per cent in 1963.

Meanwhile, it was reported, postal income is expected to rise from a total of \$3.5 billion in 1962 to \$3.75 billion this year and to \$4.5 billion in 1965.

Raises in postal rates were the reasons for the income rise, in the words of the postal law, to adjust postal rates and fees "from time to time as may be required to produce the amount of revenue approximately equal to the total cost of operating the postal establishment less the amount deemed to be attributable to the performance of public services."

The report notes that it was estimated in 1960 that by May, 1963, post office employment would total 614,000. But, it was

reported, the total by that time was only 587,000.

The department placed into effect three new systems of mail delivery during the year — the ZIP code, the ABCD service, and the VIM service.

The ZIP code is a new concept of address-by-number which is designed to speed out-of-town deliveries.

Local mail delivery speed-up, however, is the goal of the ABCD service. ABCD assures four-hour delivery of mail within designated business districts. Mail in the special ABCD boxes by 11 a.m. is delivered within the district by 3 p.m.

Crown - Zellerbach's new 20-story office building in San Francisco was the testing ground for the VIM service. In the Crown-

Zellerbach building, a post office carrier manning a basement mail room delivers the morning mail to offices through a vertical conveyor system installed by the building's owners.

Also, outgoing mail is sent down the conveyor to the room for speedy dispatch.

Noted in the report is a new delivery system to Central America, using trucks hauled from Florida to Guatemala via barge and tugboat. The system is said to cut three weeks off some delivery times.

The report says the Post Office Department is embarking on a five-year program to replace outmoded postal buildings. The goal is 6,000 new leased buildings. These are built to postal specifications by private owners who

rent them to the department on a long-term basis.

Of the 6,000 - building total, 4,200 will replace old facilities and 1,800 will house newly-established branches and stations.

During the fiscal year, 45 "face-canceller" machines were purchased for use in mail centers. These can process mail at the rate of 500 pieces per minute.

The report notes a crackdown by the Post Office Department on what it considers to be "obscene" mail. Arrests for mail obscenity have risen from 275 in 1959 to an estimated 625 in 1963. Convictions have risen at a comparable rate.

Also, the report says, the department has pressed a campaign against fraud through the mails, one section of which resulted in the Billie Sol Estes scandals.

Interest in stamp-collecting has risen sharply in the last few years, the report says.

The inverted Dag Hammarskjold commemorative stamp — originally an error — has been reprinted to provide "inverts for everybody." The stamp was on the presses five times for a total of 42 million copies.

Twenty three commemorative stamps were issued during the year — honoring people and events from the Girl Scouts to the Battle of Gettysburg.

Parents Given Controls Over Younger Drivers

Parental consent for a teenager to obtain and retain a driver's license may become more than a mere formality in many Oregon homes under a new law which took effect Sept. 2.

The law permits anyone who originally signed the driver's license application of a person under 18 to request cancellation of that license. The request must be made in writing to the Department of Motor Vehicles. Upon receipt of the written request, the department is required to cancel the license, providing the individual is still under 18 years of age.

The Department of Motor Vehicles says the law will give parents an opportunity to exercise

greater control over under-18 drivers if the driving privilege results in a school or safety problem.

PAYS FREIGHTER DAMAGE

ISTANBUL, Turkey (UPI)—Soviet Charge d'Affaires Alexei Voronine has told Foreign Minister Feridun Erkin his government will pay for the damage caused by Russian freighter Archangelsk when it rammed seaside houses on the Bosphorus, it was learned Saturday.

The 3,660-ton ship rammed the houses in thick fog last Wednesday, killing three persons and injuring 13.
