Svare Has Followers Guessing

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — The great guessing game among pro football followers currently revolves around which of his three quarterbacks coach Harland Svare will call upon to guide the Los Angeles Rams each week.

And Svare is as undecided as the club's rooters on whether to use Terry Baker, Roman Gabriel or Zeke Bratkowski, he told the Southern California Football writers Monday.

"Zeke is the most accurate passer," he said, "but Baker is the quickest mentally in judging situations and calling audibles, while Gabriel is the tallest and strongest and can throw 30 yards without getting set."

Svare said he would relish being able to have one man play quarterback all year, or at best alternating two men. But he says that thus far there was not enough difference between his three signal-callers for him to
