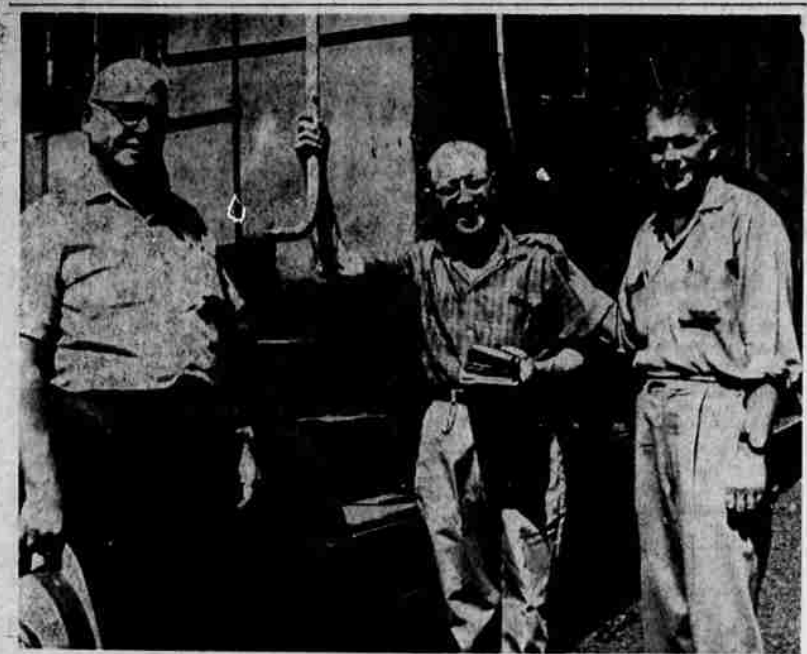

Long Time Railroader Ends Runs

ALTURAS—Eleven employees of the Southern Pacific Railroad in Alturas, who had served originally with the NC&O narrow gauge railroad before 1929, met with Southern Pacific officials to honor the retirement of Louis J. Barker on Sept. 1. Barker's retirement marked the end of 51 years of railroading, 34 of which were in Alturas.

He started in railroading as a boy of 14 working with the Denver and Rio Grande as a call boy in Grand Junction, Colo. Late in 1928 he came to Alturas to work on the narrow gauge line before it was taken over in 1929 by the Southern Pacific Company. The narrow gauge was disbanded and replaced at that time by the broad gauge rail.

For many years the Alturas terminal served as a hub of transportation for passengers and freight from the East to the Northwest. Although the passenger trains no longer run over this route, it remains one of the fastest through tracks for freight from the East to West.

Guy Brun, roadmaster of the Alturas terminal, stated that the 11 men honoring Barker represented an average of 40 years of railroading each. All of them had served or are still serving with the Southern Pacific in Alturas. "This crew of old-timers could run and maintain a complete train unit," Brun stated proudly of the railroaders.

Five of the original NC&O men at the ceremonies are still on the active railroaders board here. The retired conductor said that he would now divide his time between keeping his garden in shape in Alturas and prospecting around the Nevada and Oregon deserts. Barker and his wife, Reta, have three children, Louis Barker Jr., of Junction City, Ore.; Philip James Barker of Salt Lake City, and Thelma Barker of Alturas. They have 13 grandchildren.
