Udall Okays New Project

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Interior Secretary Stewart Udall will approve a report recommending development of the \$9 million Tualatin Reclamation project in Oregon, Sens. Maurice Neuberger and Wayne Morse, D-Ore., said today.

They said Udall would forward his favorable report to state and federal agencies for comment in review.

"We are urging that this be done promptly so that the completed Interior Department report can be considered at the current congressional session," the senators said in a statement. They said it was the largest Willamette Basin irrigation project in a decade.

The program provides for a 61,000-acre-foot reservoir behind the proposed Scoggins Dam, and some 70 miles of main canals and ditches to irrigate 17,000 acres of productive lands.
