

France, West Germany Reach Agreement On All East-West Problems

PARIS (UPI) — France and West Germany appeared today to have reached agreement on blocking any East-West pact that would confirm Soviet territorial conquests in central and eastern Europe.

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Rep. Edith Green, D-Ore., said today that Oregonians have a "great mistrust" of the civil defense program, which she described as a "dumping ground for political hacks and has-beens."

Mrs. Green, in a House speech, opposed the proposed expenditure of \$2.1 billion for fallout shelters as part of a civil defense program which she said would be of no value in a nuclear war.

Both French and German sources appeared elated by the results of the talks, but small "technical" differences of viewpoint were believed to remain.

Wants Continued Negotiations
 Schroeder was understood to have pressed for continuing negotiations with the Soviet Union, in line with current United States policy.

Couve de Murville was reported skeptical about the wisdom of pursuing any far-reaching talks with Russia now.

Further developments in the French-German alliance may come when West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer, scheduled to retire next month, meets French President Charles de Gaulle during the weekend at Rambouillet, west of Paris.

After Tuesday's conference, a French government spokesman said there was "full agreement" on all major East-West problems, "especially that everything must be done to prevent a policy which would result in the worsening of the situation in central Europe and Berlin."

Root Of Tension
 Schroeder said before flying back to Bonn Tuesday night that he and Couve de Murville were favorable to the East-West partial nuclear test ban treaty "as long as it does nothing to pre-

serve the status quo. No detente is worth anything in our eyes unless it gets to the root of the East-West tension, for example the partition of Germany."

France, which plans to proceed with its own nuclear tests to develop an independent nuclear force, has refused to sign the test ban.

Germany signed the agreement reluctantly, fearing it might imply West German recognition of Communist East Germany, also a signatory.
