Woman Given Reprieve From Long Prison Term

Joan Wood, 35, who removed her children from their guardian and fled with them to Roseburg last year, has been given a reprieve from a district attorney's motion that may have resulted in her being sentenced to the Oregon State Penitentiary for a term from 25 years to life.

That reprieve came in the form of action by Judge David R. Vandenberg who reinstated the probation of Mrs. Wood, convicted by a Klamath County jury of stealing her own children following a trial earlier this year, at the conclusion of a hearing to revoke her probation in circuit court Monday.

The motion for the hearing was filed by District Attorney Dale Crabtree after the woman failed to report to her probation officer and then left the county, in violation of her probation.

As a result of her original conviction, Mrs. Wood had been placed on five years' probation by Judge Vandenberg, but soon after she fled from the county.

Several months later she was apprehended by California police at Eureka and retained in their custody pending her return here to await a hearing on the district attorney's motion.

Mrs. Wood had been charged with unlawfully taking her children from the custody of a guardian appointed by the Klamath County Welfare Department and

Fund Campaign Underway For Chiloquin Ambulance

CHILOQUIN—A community effort to make possible replacement of the Chiloquin ambulance is under way, with organizations, city groups and individuals coordinating to raise funds for a new vehicle.

Aiding that effort will be a street dance Friday night, Sept. 27, on Chocktoot Street between the U.S. National Bank and Marie's Cafe. There will be live music and no admittance charge but a receptacle will be provided in which donations may be dropped. The area will be blocked off and dancers from all parts of the Klamath Basin are invited.

No city funds are provided for the ambulance which is vitally needed in this corner of Klamath County, removed many miles from any other ambulance service. With Dr. Robert Kerwood leaving Chiloquin, and no other doctor here, it is pointed by sponsors of the dance that Chiloquin will be more in need than ever before of ambulance service.

The present equipment, bought second hand about six years ago, is inadequate, worn out and not repairable.

All ambulance crews, upkeep and original cost has been by public subscription and donated aid. Volunteer firemen man the vehicle. The Chiloquin Fire Belles have raised funds to buy sheets, pillow cases, blankets, first aid supplies and they keep the ambulance clean. Garage repairs are also donated. The Reservation Discussion Group helped raise funds for the first ambulance.

Purchase of the equipment can be made with a down payment. Remaining payments must be raised locally and money provided for fuel, tires, and oxygen.

Approval for the Friday night dance has been given by the city council. All money raised from the dance and from the sale of hamburgers, hot dogs and coffee will also go into the ambulance fund.

The committee urges everyone to help. Those not wishing to dance may leave money with a member of the fire department, a Fire Belle or in the container at the dance.

No memberships for ambulance service can be sold. All contributions are strictly voluntary.
