Titov's Wife Gives Birth

MOSCOW (UPI) — The wife of Soviet astronaut Gherman Titov has given birth to a daughter, the Tass news agency reported today.

The 9 pound 4 ounce girl is believed to be the world's first space baby — the only child fathered by an astronaut after he has made a space flight.

Scientific sources here said the birth would go a long way toward silencing fears that space flights might induce sterility.

Titov made Russia's second space flight, orbiting the earth more than 17 times in August, 1961. He was in space more than 25 hours.

Tass said the child was born in a Moscow maternity home. "The mother and daughter feel fine," it said.

Another child born to the Titovs some years ago died.

New Postmaster Wins Approval

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Senate today confirmed John A. Gronouski, economist and tax expert, to be postmaster general in the Kennedy cabinet.

The action was by voice vote with no audible dissents.

Gronouski succeeds J. Edward Day as boss of the nation's mail operations. Day resigned to join a Washington law firm.

Before the vote on Gronouski's nomination, several senators praised his record as head of Wisconsin's state tax department and as a university economist.

Green Will Become Next Head Of Marine Corps

WASHINGTON (UPI) — President Kennedy said today he would nominate Lt. Gen. Wallace M. Greene to be commandant of the Marine Corps when Gen. David M. Shoup's term expires Dec. 31.

Shoup has completed a four-year term as head of the Marine Corps.

White House sources said the President sought to reappoint Shoup but the commandant declined on grounds of his own health and his feeling that a change would be good for the corps.

White House press secretary Pierre Salinger said the President has the "highest regard" for Shoup and he would not dismiss the possibility that Shoup might be asked to serve in some other capacity later.

Appointment of Greene must be confirmed by the Senate.

Greene has been the Marine Corps' chief of staff in Washington since Jan. 1, 1960. He was born Dec. 27, 1907, in Burlington, Vt., and lived there until his appointment to the U. S. Naval Academy class of 1930.

During World War II, Greene served in London, the Marshall Islands, Saipan and Tinian.

He and his wife, the former Vaughan H. Emory, have a daughter Vaughan, and a son Wallace M. Greene III, who also is a Marine officer.

County Lists Six Cases Of Measles

Six cases of communicable disease—four German measles—were reported in Klamath County during the week ending Sept. 14, according to information from the Oregon State Board of Health.

Klamath County led all other counties in the incidence of that disease, followed by Lake with three, and Multnomah and Josephine with two each. Four other counties each reported one case of the disease during the same period.

Meanwhile, Jackson County reported 15 cases of communicable disease, Lake County noted 10, and Josephine County had 11. The breakdown of the communicable diseases noted in each of the three counties were Jackson: Aseptic meningitis, one; pneumonia, three; influenza, two; and whooping cough, nine. Lake: Influenza, six; German measles, three; and measles, one. Josephine: Diarrhea and influenza, three each; German measles and measles, two each; and whooping cough, one.

Statewide figures for the week period showed that the most prevalent disease was influenza with 170, followed by measles, 27; pneumonia, 26; German measles, 20; whooping cough, 19, and other diseases in varying lesser numbers.

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Home Looted In Portland

PORTLAND (UPI) — A 63-year-old woman was bound and gagged in her home Monday night by two burglars who fled with \$600 they found in a radio after causing heavy damage.

Mrs. Ann N. Greenough said she came home from dinner at a restaurant and was grabbed by one of the men as she entered the house. He had a stocking over his face.

"The minute I came in, he grabbed me and put a pillowcase over my head. I managed to peek out a little and could see him on the floor counting the money," she said.

She said she was bound and gagged and shoved into a living room chair. She said the burglars overturned davenports, chairs and ripped up rugs and pillows. They searched through all rooms, including the kitchen.

When they left they also took her cigarette lighter, and house and car keys. She finally worked free enough so she could telephone police.

She described the burglars as white men in their 30's.

Rocky Visits Pope Today

VATICAN CITY (UPI) — New York's Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller today attends a scheduled audience with Pope Paul VI that raised a delicate question of Vatican protocol.

The governor, considered an announced candidate for the 1964 Republican presidential nomination, planned to call on the Roman Catholic pontiff before leaving for London on the second leg of his tour.

Vatican sources have said some high prelates felt it was "unusual" for a man who had been divorced and remarried to be received in papal audience.

Rockefeller, a Baptist, was divorced by his first wife last year. He married divorcee Margaretta Fidler (Happy) Murphy May 4. She did not plan to accompany him to the audience.

Students Ready Study In Italy

PORTLAND (UPI) — Thirty-seven students will leave here Thursday for a year's study at the Italian Studies Center in Pavia.

The center was established by Portland State College this year in cooperation with the University of Pavia.

The students will return to Portland next June.
